UNDEFEATED SEMINOLES CONTINUE HOME STAND AGAINST THE CITADEL ON FRIDAY

Florida State, which defeated Kennesaw State on Wednesday afternoon in Tallahassee, plays host to The Citadel on Friday, Nov. 24, 2017 at 8:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The game is being played as the Seminoles’ final game in the Inaugural Jamaica Classic. The Seminoles and the Bulldogs played in different brackets in the Jamaica Classic. Florida State’s game against The Citadel is its second of a two-game home stand and fifth in 11 days to open the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles enter Friday’s game riding a 23-game winning streak – the fifth longest streak in the nation. After hosting the Bulldogs, the Seminoles play four of their next five games away from Tallahassee. Following Friday’s game against The Citadel, the Seminoles travel to New Jersey to play at Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Tuesday, Nov. 28, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. THE CITADEL – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State plays host to The Citadel on November 24, 2017, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State has a 6-4 record and has won five consecutive games in the series which began on January 1, 1958. The Citadel is led by head coach Duggar Baucom who is in his third season with the Bulldogs. In seven stops as a head and assistant coach on the college level, Baucom has faced Florida State once previously. He was an assistant coach at Western Carolina when the Seminoles took a 79-69 win in Tallahassee over the Catamounts on Dec. 8, 2001. Bulldog assistant coach Daniel Willis was also a member of the Western Carolina staff that played at Florida State during the 2001-02 season. Jack Castleberry, an assistant coach for the Bulldogs, was an assistant coach at the University of Tennessee Martin during the 2007-08 season. Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton played at UT Martin (1970 and 1971), earned his bachelor’s degree from the school and is enshrined in the school’s Athletic Hall of Fame. Zach Durkee, a graduate manager for the Bulldogs, played four seasons at Charleston Southern – a team the Seminoles will face on December 18 in Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO THE CITADEL WITH 23-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State plays host to The Citadel riding a 23-game home winning streak – a streak that ranks tied for the fourth longest home court winning-streak in the nation. The Seminoles are 2-0 at home this season (with wins over George Washington and Kennesaw State), were undefeated at home during the 2016-17 season (18-0) with wins over four ranked teams (No. 7 Duke, No. 12 Louisville, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 21 Virginia Tech) and won their final three home games (against Notre Dame, Syracuse and Davidson in the NIT) to close the 2015-16 season. Florida State’s current home winning streak began with a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. The Seminoles have moved into a tie for fourth as Texas Southern plays its first 13 games on the road and doesn’t play at home until Jan. 1, 2018.

MANN AND M.J. WALKER NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM AT JAMAICA CLASSIC

Junior Terance Mann (17.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman M.J. Walker (11.0 ppg, 1.5 spg) were both named to the Jamaica Classic All-Tournament team as the Seminoles took home the championship of the event with victories over Fordham (67-43, Nov. 17) and Colorado State (90-73, Nov. 19, 2017). For Mann and Walker, it marked the first time both players had been named to an all-tournament team during their collegiate careers.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat The Citadel and win its fifth consecutive game to open the 2017-18 season. It would mark the second time since the start of the 2013-14 season that the Seminoles won at least their first five games to begin a season under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Florida State has opened a season a 5-0 under Hamilton five times (2003-04, 2008-09, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2013-14);

...Defeat The Citadel and win its sixth consecutive game against the Bulldogs. The Seminoles have won each of the games played between the two teams since an 83-67 win in Charleston on Dec. 19, 1966;

...Defeat The Citadel and gain a win over a team from the Southern Conference for the first time since topping Samford, 76-68, on Dec. 19, 2016 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16) and 26-9 (2016-17).

SEMINOLES WIN TWO EXHIBITION GAMES TO OPEN SEASON

Florida State defeated Central Missouri (116-68 on Oct. 26) and Thomas University (122-52 on Nov. 7) as it won both of its exhibition games to begin the 2017-18 season.

SEMINOLES ADD TO TROPHY CASE

Florida State's championship in the inaugural Jamaica Classic was the fifth for the Seminoles under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and first since the Seminoles won the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer classic during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles most memorable championship title under Hamilton came at the 2012 ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles' championship at the Jamaica Classic was the 16th title in an in-season championship in school history.

FLORIDA STATE TO PLAY IN 2018 ADVOCARE INVITATIONAL IN ORLANDO IN 2018

Florida State will play in the 2018 AdvoCare Invitational – to be held Thursday, Nov. 22 through Sunday, Nov. 25, at HP Field House at ESPN Wide World of Sports near Orlando, Fla. The Seminoles will be joined by Charleston, LSU, Memphis, Oklahoma State, UAB and Villanova. The eighth team will be announced at a later date. Florida State most recently played in and win the championship of this tournament (then called the Old Spice Classic) with wins over Iona, Alabama and Marquette during the 2009-10 season.

FLORIDA STATE AND THE SPIRIT OF GIVING

Florida State enters Friday's game against The Citadel ranked fourth in the ACC in assists with an 18.8 assist per game average. The Seminoles have earned at least 17 assists in each of their first four games of the season and totaled a season-high 20 in their victory over Colorado State. With 75 assists on their first 134 baskets of the season, the Seminoles are averaging an assists on nearly 56 percent of their baskets in winning their first four games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE'S LEADS IN ITS FIRST FOUR GAMES

Florida State enters Friday's game against The Citadel with a +20-point margin of victory. The Seminoles have won each of their first four games of the season by at least 17 points and have been in the lead for 156:32 of the first 160 minutes played this season (.977 percent of the total time played). Florida State's largest lead of the season (+28 points) came in their win over Fordham in the Jamaica Classic.

Florida State averaged 5.2 dunks per game during the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. THE CITADEL – THE LAST GAME

Freshman Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 26 points and led Florida State to a 66-55 win over The Citadel at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Nov. 25, 2014. Montay Brandon finished with 19 points and eight rebounds as Florida State played without starters Aaron Thomas and Devon Bookert. Brandon assumed a leadership role as the only returning starter from the 2013-14 season on the floor at tip-off. His 19 points were a career-high and the 38 minutes played matched a career-high. Ashton Moore led The Citadel with 17 points while P.J. Horgan added 12 points and six rebounds. The Citadel trailed by 10 points with five minutes remaining, but a pair of 3-pointers from Jake Wright made it a two-possession game before Florida State pulled away. Rathan-Mayes hit a fade-away midrange jumper with one minute remaining to push the lead to 60-53. He scored the final six points of the game for Florida State. The Bulldogs were swarmed by an athletic Florida State defense but still shot 47 from the field. On the opposite end, the Seminoles shot 60.5 percent from the field.

The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.606 Senior Phil Cofer enters Friday's game shooting a career-high .606 from the field as a senior. He made nine of 11 shots (.818) in scoring 21 points in the Seminoles' 98-79 win over Kennesaw State. Cofer is ranked ninth in the ACC in field goal shooting percentage.

.611 Senior Braian Angola is shooting .611 percent from the field and averaged 13.0 points in the last two games. He made seven of eight shots from the field (.875) and scored a career-high tying 17 points in Florida State's victory over Kennesaw State on Wednesday in Tallahassee.

.615 Freshman M.J. Walker is shooting .615 from the 3-point line and average 16.5 points in the last two games. He scored his career-high of 22 points as he led the Seminoles in scoring for the first time against Colorado State. He made five of eight shots from the bonusphere against the Rams as the Seminoles clinched the championship of the inaugural Jamaica Classic.

.652 Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele was a perfect four of four from the field in scoring 12 points in the Seminoles' win over Colorado State. He enters Friday's game shooting .652 from the field and has scored in double figures in three of the first four games of his career.

.875 Sophomore CJ Walker is shooting .875 from the field in the last two games and has made four consecutive free throws entering Friday's game against The Citadel. He made his final two free throws in Florida State's victory over Colorado State and was a perfect two of two from the free throw line in the Seminoles' win over Kennesaw State.

2 Senior Braian Angola and freshman Ike Obiagu both started their first career games for the Seminoles in Wednesday's victory over Kennesaw State.

3 Freshman Ike Obiagu is one of three freshman ranked in the top 10 for blocked shots in the ACC statistics. He enters Friday's game against The Citadel with nine blocked shots and a 2.3 blocked shots per game average in the first four games of his career.

4 Florida State is undefeated, 4-0, when it outscores its opponent.

4 Junior Terance Mann has scored in double figures more times in the first four games of the 2017-18 season (four) than he did in 34 games as a freshman (three).

MANN RANKED SECOND IN ACC IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE; TOP 20 IN SCORING

Junior Terance Mann, who is shooting a career-high .725 from the field, enters Friday's game against The Citadel ranked second in the ACC field goal percentage (.725) and 17th in scoring (16.0 ppg).

MANN RANKED THIRD IN SCHOOL HISTORY IN FIELD GOAL SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Junior Terance Mann is shooting a single-season career-high .725 from the field and is ranked third in school history with a .605 career field goal shooting percentage. He is one of only three players in school history shooting .600 percent or better from the field for his career. The school record for best career field goal shooting percentage is .668 by Murray Brown (1977-88).

COFER BACK TO HIS ATHLETIC SELF

Senior Phil Cofer, who has started each of the first four games of the 2017-18 season for the Seminoles, is playing the best basketball of his career to begin his fourth season in Tallahassee. He has scored in double figures in tow of the first four games of the season (15 against George Washington, career-high tying 21 against Kennesaw State), is shooting .606 from the field, is shooting .818 from the free throw line and is second on the team in rebounds with 21 and a 5.3 rebounds per game average. Cofer totaled 21 points and nine rebounds against Kennesaw State as he came one rebound shy of the second double double of his career.

CJ WALKER IN STARTING LINEUP AND IN DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING

Sophomore CJ Walker, who has made the first four starts of his career to begin the 2017-18 season, has scored in double figures in both of the Seminoles last two games (12 against Kennesaw State and 11 against Colorado State). It marks the first time in his career that he has scored in double figures in consecutive games. Walker has played at least 22 minutes in each of the first four games of the season.

FORREST AMONG TOP FIVE IN ACC IN STEALS AND ASSISTS

Sophomore Trent Forrest tied his career-high with six assists against both Colorado State and Kennesaw State and who earned three steals against both Fordham and Colorado State. He enters Friday's game against The Citadel as one of three players in the ACC ranked in the top five of both the steals AND assists categories. Forrest is ranked fifth in the ACC in both assists (5.7 apg) and steals (2.3) and is second among his Seminole teammates in both categories.

ANGOLA OFF TO A HOT START IN 2017-18

Senior Braian Angola, who tied his career-high with 17 points in the Seminoles' win over Kennesaw State, is off to the best start of his two-year Seminole career. He started the first game of his Seminole career against Kennesaw State and responded with a career-high tying 17 points (on seven of eight shooting from the field and two of three shooting from the 3-point line), pulled down a career-high seven rebounds and was credited with four assists and one blocked shot.

ANGOLA'S CAREER-HIGH'S IN 2017-18

In only the first four games of the 2017-18 season, senior Braian Angola has tied his career-high for points (17 vs. Kennesaw State), made a career-high field goals (seven against Kennesaw State), pulled down a career-high for offensive rebounds (three vs. Kennesaw State), tied his career-high for defensive rebounds (five against Colorado State), earned his career-high for assists (eight against Colorado State), tied his career-high for blocked shots (one against Kennesaw State), earned a career-high for steals (four against Colorado State) and played his career-high from minutes (31 against Colorado State).

KOUMADJE NEARS TOP-20 FOR CAREER BLOCKED SHOTS

Junior Christ Koumadje has blocked 11 shots in his first three games of the season and enters Friday's game ranked 24th in school history with 70 career blocked shots. He has blocked 70 shots in the first 64 games of his career for a 1.1 blocked shots per game average. He is only four blocked shots from moving into a tie for 20th place on Florida State's career blocked shots list.

WALKER SHOOTING WELL FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Freshman M.J. Walker, who has scored in double figures in three of the first four games of his career, is ranked third in the ACC (and first among freshmen) in 3-point field goal shooting with a .579 mark. He has made at least three 3-point field goals in three of his first four games and made his early career-high of five 3-point shots in Florida State's win over Colorado State.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. Seven different Seminoles hit a three on the night, a stark contrast from a season ago when the team ranked near the bottom of the ACC in three-point shooting and percentage. Game 4 -- Florida State 98, Kennesaw State 79

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. And he did it from all over the floor – Cofer threw down a dunk and a handful of layups, was 2 for 2 from the free-throw line and even drained his only 3-point attempt. Braian Angola (17 points, seven rebounds), Terance Mann (13 points), C.J. Walker (12) and M.J. Walker all joined Cofer in double-figures, and the Seminoles shot a season-best 42.3 percent from 3-point range. That includes a 2-of-3 mark from Angola and 3-of-5 effort from M.J. Walker, the freshman who has scored at least 11 points in three of his first four games. The Seminoles needed less than five minutes to claim their first double-digit lead, and that advantage ballooned to 25 points when Angola finished off a three-point play early in the second half. Senior guard James Scott led Kennesaw State with 17 points, 15 of which came in the second half.

Braian Angola Prospers For Colombian National Team

After moving away from his family in Villanueva, Colombia nearly seven years ago, Florida State's senior guard Braian Angola found his way back to his home country this past summer.

Born and raised in Colombia, Angola grew up with his two sisters Michel and Karol. Chasing opportunity, Angola immigrated by himself to the United States at the age of 14, where he would go on to attend Findlay Prep in Henderson, Nevada. Separated from his family at such a young age, Angola frequently visited and maintained his ties to home.

"It has been really hard just because it is my family. I love my mom and little sisters," Angola says. "When my dad passed away, I became the male figure of my house."

Prior to transferring to Florida State, Angola played his first two years of college ball at Northern Idaho College. In his second year, he earned NJCAA All-American honors and led the Cardinals to the second round of the NJCAA Tournament.

During his sophomore campaign, Angola averaged nearly 21 points, seven rebounds and four assists per game while shooting an encouraging 52 percent from the field. It was his impressive career at Northern Idaho that ultimately caught the attention of FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton.

"Coach Ham, the way that he coaches and the way that he talked to me about what he wanted to with the team," Angola says. "It encouraged me to come here and be a part of that change."

And he surely contributed quite significantly to what many Seminoles fans consider one of the best seasons in program history.

Appearing in 34 of Florida State's 35 games last season, Angola averaged nearly five points, two rebounds and one assist per contest with a .420 three-point shooting percentage. The Colombia native made a lasting impact on the Seminoles' run in the ACC Tournament, scoring a season-high 17 points during his impressive outing against Notre Dame.

With such high expectations set forth after a brilliant regular season, Florida State's year concluded with a frustrating 91-66 loss to Xavier in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

"We had such a good team and the potential to make it to the Elite Eight or the Final Four," Angola explained. "It was just one of those days that nothing was going for us. We were just trying to be a brotherhood and support each other."

With his first season competing at the Division 1 level under his belt, Angola returned to Colombia to represent his country in the FIBA Americup Tournament. As the standout player on Colombia's national team, Angola averaged just shy of 13 points, six rebounds and two assists per game throughout the tourney.

"I was really proud in myself because when I was younger, I always wanted to represent my country," Angola says. "When I went back and saw all the support that the country gives us, they were enjoying watching us play."

Yet, what really caught Angola's attention was the difference in play style when comparing international basketball to college basketball. The increased physicality in his teammates and competitors as well as the speedier pace of game were what stood out considerably when Angola took his play abroad.

“When you play for the national team, there are a lot of people that are playing for their jobs,” Angola says. “Money changes everything, it changes your mentality because now you have to take care of your family and yourself.”

Up ahead for Angola and the Seminoles is another seemingly promising season. Despite the departure of Xavier Rathan-Mayes, Dwayne Bacon and Jonathan Isaac, several new additions were made to the team to ensure another winning season for the men’s basketball program.

“We have a good chance to make it back to the tournament and win the ACC title. We have a lot of new players and players from last year that people didn’t really know,” Angola concludes. “We really care about each other. We are always talking about how we want to be brothers even after basketball.”
