UNDEFEATED SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT FLORIDA

Florida State, which is undefeated in its first six games for the first time since the 2008-09 season, travels to play No. 6 Florida at the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center in Gainesville in the Fresh from Florida Sunshine Showdown on Monday, Dec. 4, 2017 at 9:00 pm. The game will be televised by on ESPN2. Florida State enters Monday's game with a 6-0 record after winning at Rutgers on Tuesday in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Seminoles are 3-0 at home (with wins over George Washington, Kennesaw State and The Citadel), 1-0 in true road games (a victory at Rutgers) and 2-0 in neutral site games (with victories over Fordham Colorado State) as they won the championship of the inaugural Jamaica Classic. Florida State's game at Florida is its second true road game of the season and second consecutive game on an opponents' court. Florida State is in the midst of playing four of five games away from Tallahassee with its games at Rutgers and Florida, followed by a home game against Loyola (Md.) and neutral site contests against Tulane in Tampa (Dec. 10) and Oklahoma State in Sunrise, Fla. (Dec. 16). Florida State plays seven games during the month of December with three in Tallahassee, six in the state of Florida and only one (its ACC opener at Duke on Dec. 30) outside of the state. Following Monday's game against Florida, the Seminoles play host to Loyola (Md.) on Wednesday, Dec. 6 at 7:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE VS. FLORIDA – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State travels to play at Florida at the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on December 4, 2017. The Seminoles enter the Fresh from Florida Sunshine Showdown against the Gators looking to win their fourth consecutive game for the first time in series history, which dates back to the 1951-52 season. The Seminoles are also playing for their second consecutive win in Gainesville since January 26, 1981 and December 23, 1983. Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton enters the game against Florida with six wins against the Gators and is looking become Florida State's all-time winningest coach against Florida. Pat Kennedy also won six games against Florida during his 11-year tenure as Florida State's head coach. The Gators are coached by Mike White who is in his third season at Florida. The Seminoles defeated White and the Gators in his first game of the Seminole-Gator rivalry by a 73-71 margin on December 29, 2015 at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center and defeated the Gators by an 83-78 score on December 11, 2016 in Tallahassee. White is 1-3 against Florida State during his career with a 1-1 record against the Seminoles while he was at Louisiana Tech (two NIT games) and an 0-2 record as the head coach at Florida. Dusty May, an assistant coach on the Florida staff, has coached against the Seminoles twice (while at Louisiana Tech) and has a 1-1 record in two games against Florida State. Jordan Mincy and Kyle Church, both in their third seasons at Florida, have coached against Florida State three times – twice with the Gators during the 2015-16 season and once at Louisiana Tech during the 2014-15 season and are both 0-3 against the Seminoles.

SEMINOLES LOOKING TO WIN THEIR FOURTH STRAIGHT AGAINST FLORIDA

Florida State enters Monday's game against Florida looking to win its fourth consecutive game against the Gators. The Seminoles' current three-game winning streak against Florida marks the fourth time in the history of the series (1969, 1978, 79; 1995, 1996, 1997; 2006, 2007, 2008; 1014, 2015, 2016) that Florida State has won three straight against the Gators, most recently during the 2006, 2007 and 2008 seasons. Two of the four three-game winning streaks in school history have come under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton (2006, 2007 and 2008 and the current winning streak) with the first coming under Hugh Durham and the second under Pat Kennedy.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 5-0 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES ADD TO TROPHY CASE

Florida State's championship in the inaugural Jamaica Classic was the fifth for the Seminoles under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and first since the Seminoles won the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer classic during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles most memorable championship title under Hamilton came at the 2012 ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles' championship at the Jamaica Classic was the 16th title in an in-season championship in school history.

MANN AND M.J. WALKER NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM AT JAMAICA CLASSIC

Junior Terance Mann (17.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman M.J. Walker (11.0 ppg, 1.5 spg) were both named to the Jamaica Classic All-Tournament team as the Seminoles took home the championship of the event with victories over Fordham (67-43, Nov. 17) and Colorado State (90-73, Nov. 19, 2017). For Mann and Walker, it marked the first time both players had been named to an all-tournament team during their collegiate careers.

SEMINOLES' M.J. WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman guard M.J. Walker, a consensus top-25 high school player in 2017, is on the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award watch list as named by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Walker is the 12th McDonald's All-American in Florida State history. He is one of two true freshmen and one of five players from the ACC on the 2018 Jerry West Award watch list.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE DEFENSIVE

Florida State, which is looking to regain its Junkyard Dog defensive mindset under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, is one of the nation's top defensive teams. The Seminoles and Syracuse are the only two teams in the ACC ranked in the top five of the conference statistics for steals per game (9.3, first), blocked shots per game (6.3, fourth) and field goal percentage defense (.375, fourth). Florida State led the nation in the field goal percentage defense category in both 2010 and 2011. The Seminoles held George Washington to a .231 shooting mark from the field (12 of 52) in their season-opening victory over the Colonials on Nov. 14.

FLORIDA STATE OFFENSIVELY

Florida State enters Monday's game against Florida ranked third in the ACC in scoring (88.8 ppg), second in the ACC in field goal percentage shooting (.517) and third in the ACC in scoring margin (+20 ppg). The Seminoles have scored at least 78 points in five of their first six games, have shot 51 percent or better from the field in four of their first six and have won three of their first six games by at least 20 points. Florida State scored its season-high of 113 points in its victory over The Citadel (113-78, Nov. 24), shot a season-high .559 from the field (38 of 68) in their win over George Washington (Nov. 14) and defeated The Citadel by 35 points (113-78, Nov. 24).

FLORIDA STATE VS. FLORIDA – THE LAST GAME

Dwayne Bacon scored 24 points to lead Florida State to an 83-78 win over No. 21 Florida on Dec. 22, 2016 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. It is the Seminoles' first victory over a ranked nonconference team at home since they beat the Gators on Dec. 7, 2008. Florida State led by 13 midway through the second half before the Gators started to slowly chip away. Florida used a 14-5 run to get within three, but could not get closer. Terance Mann had 16 points and 10 rebounds for his first career double-double. Kasey Hill scored a career-high 21 points for Florida, and KeVaughn Allen added 15. The win was the Seminoles' third straight over the Gators.

The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

FLORIDA STATE HAS...

...Had six different leading scorers in each of its first six games, earned at least seven steals in all six games, had a positive assist:turnover ratio in five of six games and shot better than 37 percent from the 3-point line in all but one of their first six games.

.392 Junior Terance Mann, who ranks second on the team in rebounds, has pulled down more than 48 percent of his rebounds on the offensive end of the court for the Seminoles this season. For his career, he has pulled down more than 39 percent of rebounds (124 of 316) on the offensive end of the court.

.412 Sophomore CJ Walker is shooting .412 from the 3-point line (seven of 17) in the last four games. He has made two shots from the bonusphere in wins over Colorado State (Nov. 19), Kennesaw State (Nov. 22) and Rutgers (Nov. 28).

.500 Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele, Florida State's leader in rebounds with 36 and a 6.0 rpg average, has pulled down exactly half of his rebounds (18 of 36) on the offensive end of the court.

3 Sophomore PJ Savoy started the first three games of the season (George Washington, Fordham, Colorado State) for the first three starting assignments of his career.

3 Junior Terance Mann ranked third in school history with a .593 career field goal shooting percentage.

4 Sophomore CJ Walker totaled a career-high four steals in Florida State's victory over Rutgers. He has seven steals in the last three games (2.3 spg) entering Monday's game against Florida.

4 Freshman M.J. Walker has earned at least one steal in four of Florida State's six games this season.

4 Florida State overcame a four-point deficit on three different occasions in the first half to defeat Rutgers by a 78-73 margin in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The four-point deficits were the Seminoles' largest of the season.

5 Sophomore Trent Forrest has at least one steal in each of the five games he has played this season with his season-high of three steals coming in the Seminoles' victories over Fordham (Nov. 17) and Colorado State (Nov. 19) in winning the championship of the Jamaica Classic.

5 Florida State is one of five remaining undefeated teams in the ACC entering Monday's game at Florida.

6 Six different Seminoles (Terance Mann vs. George Washington; Mfiondu Kabengele vs. Fordham; M.J. Walker vs. Fordham; Phil Cofer vs. Kennesaw State, Braian Angola and Terance Mann vs. The Citadel and CJ Walker vs. Rutgers) have led Florida State in scoring in the first six games of the year.

PHIL COFER'S RESURGENCE ON THE COURT

Senior Phil Cofer, who was limited by injuries in the last two seasons, enters Monday's game against Florida averaging a career-high 14.2 points per game and a career-high 4.7 rebounds per games. He has started each of Florida State's first six games of the season and has scored in double figures in each of the last three games entering the Seminoles' contest against the Gators. Cofer's six starts give him 35 for his career (and most since he started 24 games as a freshman) and he has scored in double figures (21 against Kennesaw State, 15 against the Citadel and 19 against Rutgers) in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.

Sophomore CJ Walker scored his career-high of 24 points in Florida State's victory over Rutgers in New Jersey in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and did all of his scoring in a very efficient way. He was six of 11 from the field (.545 percent), two of three from the 3-point line (.667 percent) and a near-perfect 10 of 11 from the free throw line (.909 percent) to score his career-high high and the most points by a Florida State player this season.

DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING FOR WALKER

Sophomore CJ Walker has scored in double figures as many times this season (three) as he did in 33 games (three) as a freshman. Walker has scored in double figures in victories over Colorado State (11 points), Kennesaw State (12 points) and Rutgers (24 points) this season after scoring in double figures against Illinois (13 points), George Washington (11 points) and Wake Forest (13 points) as a freshman.

He scored on a made free throw shot at the 13:36 mark, on a made 3-point shot at the 13:09 mark, on a second made 3-point shot at the 12:53 mark and on three made free throws (after he was fouled taking a 3-point shot) at the 12:36 mark. Walker gave the Seminoles a lead they would not relinquish for the remainder of the game in earning the victory.

TRENT FORREST IN THE LAST TWO GAMES...

...Is averaging 9.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game. He totaled his season-high of 10 points in Florida State's victory over The Citadel (Nov. 24) and totaled eight second half points (eight total for the game) in the Seminoles' victory over Rutgers.

FORREST CALLED THE MOST COMPLETE DEFENDER BY SEMINOLE COACHING STAFF

Sophomore Trent Forrest, who led the Seminoles in steals with 43 in 2016-17, has been called Florida State's most complete defender by the coaching staff. The staff has called Brian Angola the Seminoles' best on-ball defender, Phil Cofer the best off-ball defender, Christ Koumadje the best rim protector and Forrest to the most complete defender on the Seminoles' roster.

6 Florida State is undefeated, 6-0, when it outscores its opponent.

7 Florida State enters Monday's game against Florida looking to improve to 7-0 for the first time since the 2008-09 season and for the second time under Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles advanced to the championship game of the 2009 ACC Tournament for the first time in school history at the end of the 2009 season. The Seminoles were undefeated in their first 10 games of the 2003-04 season.

8.8 Florida State averages 8.8 3-point field goals made per game. It made a season-high 14 in its victory over The Citadel (Nov. 24). The Seminoles averaged 6.7 3-point field goals in earning a 26-9 overall record and a 12-6 record (second place) in the ACC.

9 Sophomore CJ Walker has made nine consecutive free throws entering Monday's game against Florida. He was 10 of 11 from the free throw line against Rutgers and made his final nine free throws in the win over the Scarlet Knights.

9 Florida State turned the basketball over a season-low nine times in its victory over Rutgers (a season-low four in the first half and five in the second half).

10 Freshman Ike Obiagu has blocked 10 shots in his last three games and ranked fourth in the ACC with a 2.8 blocked shots per game average. He is one of only two freshmen in the ACC (Wendell Carter of Duke is ranked sixth, 2.2 bpg) ranked in the ACC's top 10 for blocked shots.

12 Florida State totaled a season-high 12 steals in its victories over Fordham (Nov. 17) and Rutgers (Nov. 28).

12 Florida State has outscored its opponents in each of its 12 halves of basketball in the first six games of the 2017-18 season.

22 Sophomore CJ Walker scored 22 of his 24 points in the second half of Florida State's victory over Rutgers. He totaled his 22 points while playing all 20 minutes of the second half as Florida State helped the ACC win the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

22.2 Sophomore Trent Forrest has played at least 20 minutes in each of his first five games of the season and is averaging 22.4 minutes played per game during the 2017-18 season. He averaged 15.4 minutes played per game as a freshman in becoming the first Seminole freshman since Heisman Trophy winning point guard Charlie Ward to lead the team in steals.

Senior Braian Angola has started each of the last three games for the Seminoles (the first three starts of his Division I career) and has played well in that role. He scored his career-high of 21 points as a starter against The Citadel (Nov. 24), totaled his career-high of seven rebounds as a starter in the Seminoles' victory over Kennesaw State (Nov. 22) and has totaled 11 assists in his three games as a starter. Angola played his career-high of 32 minutes as a starter in Florida State's victory over Rutgers (Nov. 28).

NOTING BRAIAN ANGOLA'S STATISTICAL LINE AGAINST THE CITADEL

Senior Braian Angola scores his career-high of 21 points, tied his career high with seven field goals made, tied his career-high with 11 field goals attempted, made a career-high seven 3-point field goals, attempted a career-high 11 3-point field goals and pulled down a career-high five defensive rebounds in Florida State's victory over The Citadel (Nov. 24). Game 6 -- Florida State 78, Rutgers 73

Piscataway, N.J. -- CJ Walker scored 24 points and Phil Cofer added 19 to lead unbeaten Florida State past Rutgers 78-73. Walker was 6 of 11 from the floor and made 10 of 11 free throws. Cofer was 7-of-11 shooting and made four 3-pointers. Ike Ogiabu grabbed 10 rebounds and chipped in five points for Florida State. Eugene Omoruyi scored 22 points to lead Rutgers (6-1). Corey Sanders added 20 points, and Deshawn Freeman followed up his first double-double of the season with 15 points and 16 rebounds. Freeman energized the crowd when he was fouled by Mfiondu Kabengele, raising his arms several times to get the crowd to its feet with 14:35 remaining. Rutgers went on to take a 44-41 lead after Omoruyi converted the 3-point play and Freeman made a pair of free throws. Walker then scored the next 11 points for the Seminoles, hitting 5 of 7 from the line and a pair of 3-pointers. Trent Forrest made a layup and Florida State led 53-45 with 12:28 to play. The Scarlet Knights pulled to 69-66 after Omoruyi's layup with 1:56 to go, but they didn't get closer.

Phil Cofer Brings A Blue-Collar Mentality, Leadership To Florida State Basketball

Phil Cofer is finally healthy and it shows.

Florida State's 6-foot-8 senior forward has recovered physically from ankle surgery that prematurely ended his sophomore season and mentally with the confidence to believe he can take the pounding of an entire college basketball season.

And on a team of young slashers and shooters, Cofer is the blue-collar glue as the Seminoles have raced out to a 6-0 record.

Entering Monday's game against No. 6 Florida, Cofer is second to Terance Mann in scoring with 14.2 points per game and shooting percentage at .642, is third in rebounding with 4.7 per game and is second among starters with the fewest turnovers (seven).

In his last three games, Cofer is shooting 23 of 31 (.742) and averaging 18.0 points. He's also developed more of an outside game and in the Seminoles' 78-73 victory over Rutgers last Tuesday he connected on 4 of 6 3-point attempts.

Prior to that, Cofer was 2 of 7 from the 3-point arc this season. He attempted only 32 3-points in three seasons before this year, making 12.

"My teammates are getting me the ball in those situations," he said. "We do a lot of drive-and-kick and it's what has been opening up the shots. I've worked on my shooting, a lot of repetition, and it's helped a lot."

But what has helped mainly is that Cofer can run and jump for a full game and not worry about his ankle — or his back and foot, other areas where he has had injury problems during his college career.

After a promising freshman season in which he averaged 6.9 points and 4.5 rebounds, and started the last 24 games of the season, Cofer required surgery in January of 2016 to remove a cyst in his ankle after playing only 11 games as a sophomore.

Cofer played in 32 games last season but averaged only 2.9 points and 1.9 rebounds. FSU assistant coach C.Y. Young, who recruited Cofer, said it was understandable that Cofer was tentative most of the season.

"The entire season, you could see him limping and favoring it," Young said. "He always said it didn't hurt but you could see when he ran he was obviously favoring one side more than the other. It was like he didn't want to put his foot on the ground."

Late in the season, Cofer began to get more confident about the ankle. And Young said the day after the Seminoles were eliminated in the NCAA Tournament in Orlando by Xavier, Cofer was in the gym.

"The next season started for him the day after our last game," Young said. "He was in the gym around the clock. I don't think he took any time off. That's the one thing about Phil, is that you never have to coach effort."

This season, Cofer is pain-free and looking forward to the rest of his senior season.

"Injuries take a toll on anybody," he said. "What's helping me is not dwelling on it. I'm leaving it in the past." Cofer, who played high school basketball at Whitewater High School in Fayetteville, Ga., said he received strong guidance from his parents, former Detroit Lions Pro Bowl defensive end Michael Cofer, and former University of

Tennessee basketball player Reba Cofer. Working hard and playing to win were stressed while being raised by the two elite athletes.

“Being competitive runs in my family,” he said. “Even in little things, like playing games, it’s competitive. My Dad and Mom gave me tremendous support. It kept me going.”

Cofer said some of the most heated games he’s played in were two-on-two basketball in his back yard: he and his brother vs. Dad and Mom.

“Mom still has her jump shot,” Cofer said. “They whipped us a few times before we finally got a little older and bigger.”

Given his parents’ background at Tennessee (his father played for Johnny Majors), Cofer intended to continue that family tradition. But when Cuonzo Martin was fired as the Volunteers coach in 2014, Cofer backed off his verbal commitment and signed with FSU coach Leonard Hamilton.

“Coach Martin and I had a great relationship,” Cofer said. “When he left I decided I had other options. I couldn’t have made a better choice; Coach Hamilton is like another father to me. He thinks of you as a person, not a basketball player. Everything happens for a reason.”

Cofer’s teammates say his leadership will be the glue in whatever success the Seminoles have this season.

“He brings the energy every day,” Mann said. “We all hurt for him when he was injured but he’s playing great now. It’s not just scoring, but all the little things that are important, like defense and rebounding. If he’s not scoring he’s always doing something else to help the team.”

Young offered an example. He said Cofer is a master at help-side defense (covering a man who has beaten his nearest teammate), forcing the offensive player to stop cutting or pick up his dribble, then moving back quickly to guard his man.

“That doesn’t show up in the stat sheet,” Young said. “He does a bunch of little things that don’t, but help us win. He brings an energy, physicality and toughness to this team.”

Young also said Cofer has been a leader from day one.

“He’s gotten that from his parents,” Young said. “Even as a freshman he didn’t hesitate to tell upperclassmen, ‘hey, listen to the coaches ... do your job.’”

It took four years, but Cofer has gone from role player to one of the team’s stars. Young said it’s rewarding to watch.

“Whatever success he has this season, he’s earned it,” Young said. “But for Phil, it will be all about the team success. It’s all he’s ever cared about.”
