## FLORIDA STATE RETURNS HOME FOR TWO-GAME HOMESTAND AGAINST KENNESAW

Florida State, which won the championship of the Inaugural Jamaica Classic with victories over Fordham and Colorado State in Montego Bay, Jamaica, play host to Kennesaw State on Wednesday, Nov. 22, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. The game marks the first between the two teams. The Seminoles are home for two games in three days against Kennesaw State and The Citadel before playing four of their next five away from the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Kennesaw State with a 22-game home winning streak – the fifth longest such streak in the nation. Following its game against Kennesaw, the Seminoles play host to The Citadel on Friday, Nov. 24, 2017 at 8:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

## FLORIDA STATE VS. KENNESAW STATE – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State will play host to Kennesaw State on November 22, 2017, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. It marks the first meeting between the Seminoles and the Owls in the sport of men's basketball. The game features two Big East Coaches of the Year in Leonard Hamilton (1995 and 1999 at Miami) and Al Skinner (2001 and 2005 at Boston College) and the two winningest coaches at two ACC schools (Hamilton at Florida State and Skinner at Boston College). Skinner totaled a 247-165 record at Boston College from 1997-2010. During Skinner's tenure at Boston College, he was 4-3 against Florida State as he ushered the Eagles' basketball team into the ACC. Prior to his tenure at Boston College, Skinner was the head coach at Rhode Island where he was 0-1 against Florida State as the Seminoles gained a 95-76 win over Skinner at Rhode Island on December 29, 1989. Florida State's Hamilton was 4-0 against Boston College's Skinner when the two coached against each other in the Big East (1998-2000).

## SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO KENNESAW WITH 22-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State plays host to Kennesaw State with a 22-game home winning streak – a streak that ranks as the fifth longest in the nation. The Seminoles won their first home game of the 2017-18 season against George Washington (Nov. 14, 87-67), were undefeated at home during the 2016-17 season (18-0) with wins over four ranked teams (No. 7 Duke, No. 12 Louisville, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 21 Virginia Tech) and won their final three home games (against Notre Dame, Syracuse and Davidson in the NIT) to close the 2015-16 season. Florida State's current home winning streak began with a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016.

## FLORIDA STATE WINS INAUGURAL JAMAICA CLASSIC

Florida State defeated both Fordham (Nov. 17, 67-43) and Colorado State (No. 19, 90-73) at the Montego Bay Convention Centre to win the championship of the Inaugural Jamaica Classic. Junior Terance Mann and freshman M.J. Walker were named to the Jamaica Classic All-Tournament team.

## FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSIVE NUMBERS AFTER THREE GAMES

Florida State limited its first three opponents to an average of 61.0 points per game, a .354 combined field goal shooting mark (62-175), a combined .236 mark from the 3-point line (17 of 72), have blocked 19 shots (6.3 blocked shots per game) and have earned 30 steals (10.0 steals per game). The Seminoles have blocked more than 10 percent of their opponents' 175 shots and have forced 64 turnovers (21.3 turnovers per game).

## SEMINOLES IN THE NCAA STATISTICS

Florida State is tied for 23<sup>rd</sup> nationally in blocked shots with a 6.3 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles have blocked 19 shots (eight against George Washington; nine against Fordham and two against Colorado State) in their first three shots of the season. In addition, the Seminoles are tied for 20<sup>th</sup> nationally with a 10.0 steals per game average (30 steals in three games).

## LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Kennesaw State and win its 23<sup>rd</sup> consecutive home game – a streak that began on Feb. 27, 2016 against Notre Dame. The Seminoles were undefeated, 18-0, at home during the 2016-17 season;  
...Defeat Kennesaw State and gain its first win over the Owls in the first game played between the two teams;  
...Defeat Kennesaw State and improve its record to 4-0. It would mark the second consecutive season and the eighth time under Leonard Hamilton that the Seminoles will have won at least their first four games of a season.

**FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS**

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16) and 26-9 (2016-17).

**SEMINOLES WIN TWO EXHIBITION GAMES TO OPEN SEASON**

Florida State defeated Central Missouri (116-68 on Oct. 26) and Thomas University (122-52 on Nov. 7) as it won both of its exhibition games to begin the 2017-18 season.

**SEMINOLES' M.J. WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST**

Florida State freshman guard M.J. Walker, who scored 22 points in Florida State's victory over Colorado State on Nov. 19, was named to the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award watch list by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Walker averaged 27.8 points and 6.5 rebounds as a senior at Jonesboro (Ga.) High School and became the 12<sup>th</sup> McDonald's All-American in Florida State history when he signed to play for Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton in May of 2017. Walker (Jonesboro, Ga.) is one of two true freshmen and one of five players from the ACC on the 2018 Jerry West Award watch list. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Mr. West and the Hall of Fame's selection committee. The winner of the award will be presented on April 6, 2018. Previous winners of the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award include Malik Monk of Kentucky (2017), Buddy Hield of Oklahoma (2016) and D'Angelo Russell of Ohio State (2015).

**SEMINOLES ADD TO RECORD BOOK WITH DEFENSIVE EFFORT AGAINST FORDHAM**

Florida State turned in one of the most dominating defensive performances in school history as it limited Fordham to 43 points on a .231 percent shooting from the field and defeated the Rams by a 67-43 margin on Nov. 17 in the Jamaica Classic. The Seminoles' .231 field goal percentage defense mark is tied for the fifth best in school history and was their best since limiting George Washington to a .226 shooting mark in a 67-48 win on Dec. 4, 2016. Florida State allowed the Rams to make only 12 field goals. The Seminoles have held their first two opponents to a .313 shooting percentage. Florida State led the nation in both 2010 and 2011 in field goal percentage defense and the 1998 Miami Hurricanes (also coached by Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton) led the nation in field goal percentage defense.

**MANN NOW RANKED THIRD IN CAREER FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE**

Junior Terance Mann, who is averaging a team-leading 17.0 points per game, begins play in Wednesday's game against Kennesaw State ranked third in school history with a career field goal shooting percentage of .593. He made his first seven shots of the season against George Washington and hasn't often missed the basket in the first three games of the season. Mann then made eight of ten shots against George Washington (.800 percent), seven of nine shots from the field (.778 percent) in scoring 14 points in Florida State's victory over Fordham and made eight of 12 shots (.667 percent) in scoring 20 points against Colorado State in the championship game of the Jamaica Classic. Mann enters Wednesday's game against Kennesaw State shooting a team-leading and career-high .742 from the field (23 of 31). His shooting percentage actually went after shooting .750 from the field (eight of 12) in the Seminoles' win over Colorado State.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. Seven different Seminoles hit a three on the night, a stark contrast from a season ago when the team ranked near the bottom of the ACC in three-point shooting and percentage. The depth on the roster, especially of those with shooting capabilities provides FSU with more versatility on the offensive end than it had last year. The game also provided a first glimpse of some new faces for the Seminoles, including the debut of highly recruited M.J.Walker. The true freshman dropped 17 points in his first game dawning the Garnet and Gold. Flashes of the athleticism that made him a five-star recruit appeared against the Mules, while the Jonesboro, Ga., native also showed some ability from the 3-point line.

Redshirt freshman Mfondu Kabengele scored 10 in his debut and 7-foot freshman center Ike Obiagu made the most of his time on the floor with three blocks in just seven minutes.
