SEMINOLES RETURN HOME TO PLAY HOST TO LOYOLA OF MARYLAND

Florida State, which defeated No. 5 Florida on Monday night in Gainesville, returns home and plays host to Loyola on Wednesday, Dec. 6, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles' game against the Greyhounds is their first home game since a 113-78 win over The Citadel on Nov. 24 and is sandwiched between true road games at Rutgers (Nov. 28, Win, 78-73) and at Florida (Dec. 4, Win, 83-66) and two games played at neutral sites (vs. Tulane in Tampa, Dec. 10 and vs. Oklahoma State in Sunrise, Fla.). The Seminoles are one of 12 remaining undefeated teams in Division I and are one of four ACC teams (Florida State, Duke, Virginia and Miami) who have yet to lose a game. Florida State enters Wednesday's game with a perfect 7-0 record and have won their first seven games of a season for the first time since the 2008-09 season when it also started 7-0. The Seminoles started the 2003-04 season by winning their first 10 games. Following Wednesday's game against Loyola, the Seminoles will play Tulane at the Amalie Arena in Tampa on Sunday, Dec. 10, 2017 at 12 Noon.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LOYOLA – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State plays host to Loyola College at the Donald L. Tucker Center on December 6, 2017. The game between the Seminoles and the Greyhounds marks the second meeting between the two teams in the sport of men's basketball. Florida State defeated Loyola on November 17, 1997, 89-72, in the second round of the Preseason NIT in Tallahassee in the first meeting between the two teams. G.G. Smith, who is the son of current University of Memphis Head Coach Tubby Smith, is in his sixth season as the head coach at Loyola. He was a graduate assistant coach at the University of Kentucky during the 2001 and 2002 seasons – a school where Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton helped the Wildcats win the national championship in 1978. Keith Booth, who earned All-American honors at Maryland in 1997, is an assistant coach at Loyola. Booth helped lead Maryland to a 7-2 record against Florida State during his career in the ACC. Trevor Quinn, also an assistant coach on the Loyola staff, was a graduate assistant on Hamilton's staff at Florida State University from 2005-2007.

SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO LOYOLA WITH 24-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State plays host to Loyola with a 24-game home winning streak – a streak that ranks as the third longest home court winning-streak in the nation. The Seminoles are 3-0 at home this season (with wins over George Washington, Kennesaw State and the Citadel), were undefeated at home during the 2016-17 season (18-0) with wins over four ranked teams (No. 7 Duke, No. 12 Louisville, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 21 Virginia Tech) and won their final three home games (against Notre Dame, Syracuse and Davidson in the NIT) to close the 2015-16 season. Florida State's current home winning streak began with a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. The Seminoles began the season with the fifth longest home court winning streak in the nation. Florida State moved up to fourth with its first three wins of the season and into third when Oregon lost at home to Boise State at home on Dec. 1. The Ducks entered the season with a 46-game home court winning streak. Cincinnati currently holds the nation's longest home winning streak.

FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORY OVER NO. 5 FLORIDA

The Seminoles' 17-point win at No. 5 Florida on Tuesday is Florida State's most lopsided true road victory against an AP Top-25 team in the school's ACC era (since the 1991-92 season). It's previous largest margin of victory over a nationally ranked team was 65-51 also at Florida, then No. 25 on Nov. 23, 2007.

THE NATION'S REMAINING UNDEFEATED TEAMS

Florida State is one of 12 undefeated teams remaining in Division I college basketball as of Dec. 4, 2017. The Seminoles are joined by Arizona State (7-0), Duke (10-0), Kansas (7-0), Miami (7-0), Mississippi State (7-0), Nevada (8-0), Texas A&M (7-0), TCU (8-0), Valparaiso (6-0), Virginia (8-0) and Villanova (8-0).

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 5-0 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES ADD TO TROPHY CASE

Florida State's championship in the inaugural Jamaica Classic was the fifth for the Seminoles under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and first since the Seminoles won the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer classic during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles most memorable championship title under Hamilton came at the 2012 ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles' championship at the Jamaica Classic was the 16th title in an in-season championship in school history.

MANN AND M.J. WALKER NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM AT JAMAICA CLASSIC

Junior Terance Mann (17.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman M.J. Walker (11.0 ppg, 1.5 spg) were both named to the Jamaica Classic All-Tournament team as the Seminoles took home the championship of the event with victories over Fordham (67-43, Nov. 17) and Colorado State (90-73, Nov. 19, 2017). For Mann and Walker, it marked the first time both players had been named to an all-tournament team during their collegiate careers.

SEMINOLES' M.J. WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman guard M.J. Walker, a consensus top-25 high school player in 2017, is on the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award watch list as named by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Walker is the 12th McDonald's All-American in Florida State history. He is one of two true freshmen and one of five players from the ACC on the 2018 Jerry West Award watch list.

HAMILTON'S VICTORIES OVER TOP 5 RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's 83-66 victory over No. 5 Florida was the 11th victory by the Seminoles over a top-five ranked team during the Leonard Hamilton era at Florida State (2003-Pr). The Seminoles' victory over the No. 5 Gators marked the Seminoles' second true road victory over a top-five ranked team (under Hamilton) and first since they won at Cameron Indoor Stadium over then No. 4 Duke, 76-73, on Jan. 21, 2012. Florida State won that game as a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by Michael Snaer and went on to win the first ACC Championship in school history. Florida State defeated then No. 4 ranked North Carolina to win the ACC Championship at Philips Arena in Atlanta. With his 11 victories over top-five ranked teams at Florida State, Hamilton has now defeated 13 top-five ranked teams during his head coaching career (11 at Florida State, one at Oklahoma State and one at Miami). Hamilton has now defeated 59 nationally ranked teams during his head coaching career.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LOYOLA – THE LAST GAME

Randell Jackson scored 25 points and pulled down eight rebounds, Terrell Baker scored 15 points and totaled four rebounds and Ron Hale scored off the bench as Florida State defeated Loyola, 89-72, at the Tallahassee Leon County Civic Center on Nov. 17, 1997 in the second round of the Preseason NIT. The game was played utilizing experimental rules that included four quarters of 10 minutes each instead of two halves of 20 minutes each. Florida State won each of the four individual quarters to gain the 17-point victory. Karim Shabazz totaled nine of the Seminoles'40 rebounds as the Seminoles outrebounded Loyola by a 40-28 margin. Shabazz totaled four blocked shots and Thompson totaled four steals as Florida State played well defensively with six blocked shots and 10 steals. Jason Rowe led four Greyhounds in double figures with 24 points on 14 of 16 made free throws. Mike Powell totaled 19 points and Roderick Platt totaled a game-high nine rebounds. Florida State shot .615 percent from the field (32 of 63) while limiting Loyola to .375 shooting from the field (21 of 56). The Seminoles led 48-39 at the intermission.

THE JAM WITH HAM WINNERS

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton unveiled the 2017-18 team to the adoring Seminole crowd at the ninth annual Jam with Ham at Tully Gymnasium – complete with a 1980's themed program that included 80's music and Hamilton himself dressed in his best throwback suit blended with a kaleidoscope of colors that certainly drew the loudest cheers of the night. The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.889 Senior Braian Angola is shooting .889 from the free throw line (eight of nine) in the last two games and enters Wednesday's game against Loyola having made four consecutive free throws.

0:00 Florida State did not trail in its victories over Kennesaw State (Nov. 22) or The Citadel (Nov. 24) in winning both games.

3 Sophomore PJ Savoy started the first three games of the season (George Washington, Fordham, Colorado State) for the first three starting assignments of his career.

4 Four Seminoles – Terance Mann (16.7 ppg), Phil Cofer (13.6 ppg), CJ Walker (11.0 ppg) and Braian Angola (11.1 ppg) are averaging in double figure scoring for the Seminoles entering Wednesday's game against Loyola.

4 Florida State overcame a four-point deficit on three different occasions in the first half to defeat Rutgers by a 78-73 margin in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The four-point deficits were the Seminoles' largest of the season.

4 Florida State is one of four remaining undefeated teams in the ACC entering Monday's game at Florida.

7 Florida State is undefeated, 7-0, when it outscores its opponent.

7 Florida State has led each of its first seven games of the season at halftime and has outscored its opponent in each of the first 14 halves of basketball to open the 2017-18 season.

8 Florida State has defeated eight ranked teams in the last two seasons including No. 5 Florida on Monday night in Gainesville.

8 Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Loyola looking to improve to 8-0 for the first time since the 2003-04 season and for the second time under Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles were undefeated in their first 10 games of the 2003-04 season.

9 Terance Mann's career-high 25-point performance against Florida has vaulted him into the top-10 of the ACC in scoring. He enters Wednesday's game against Loyola ranked ninth in the ACC with a 16.7 points per game scoring average.

9 Florida State turned the basketball over a season-low nine times in its victory over Rutgers (a season-low four in the first half and five in the second half).

12 Florida State totaled a season-high 12 steals in its victories over Fordham (Nov. 17) and Rutgers (Nov. 28).

30 Sophomore CJ Walker scored 10 points in one minute of playing time in the second half of the Seminoles' victory over Rutgers. His 10 points in that magical moment was more than he scored in 30 games as a freshman. He played in 33 games during the 2016-17 season and scored 10 points or more in three different games.

FLORIDA STATE NOTES

...Florida State has won at least its first seven games of the season for the third time under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles win their first 10 games to open the 2003-04 season, and its first seven to begin the 2008-09 and 2017-18 seasons.

...Florida State has won six of its first seven games by at least 17 points and are ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring margin (+19.6 ppg). The Seminoles defeated The Citadel by a season-high +35 (113-78) and defeated two teams (Fordham, +24 and George Washington, +20) by at least 20 points.

...Florida State enjoyed its largest positive rebounding margin (+17) in its victory over No. 5 Florida. The Seminoles outrebounded The Citadel by +14 and are ranked sixth in the ACC in rebounding margin for the season (+5.9).

...Florida State has earned at least 51 rebounds in two of its last three games – a season-high 53 vs. The Citadel and 51 vs. Florida.

...Florida State pulled down a season-high 23 offensive rebounds in its victory over Florida. The Seminoles' previous season-high was 17 offensive rebounds against Kennesaw State.

...Florida State won the second chance points battle against Florida by a 24-8 margin – the fifth time in seven games (also against Fordham, Colorado State, Kennesaw State and The Citadel) the Seminoles have won the second-chance points battle.

...Florida State earned eight steals in its victory over Florida. The Seminoles have earned at least seven steals in each of their first seven games and are ranked second in the ACC in steals with a 9.1 steals per game average. The Seminoles earned a season-high 12 steals in its wins over Fordham and at Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

...Florida State shot its best percentage of the season from the free throw line (20 of 24, .833 percent) in its victory over No. 5 Florida. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles have .750 or better from the free throw line.

...Florida State has used the same starting lineup in the last four games - Phil Cofer, Ike Obiagu, CJ Walker, Braian Angola and Terance Mann. Cofer, Walker and Mann are the only players who have started each of the first seven games of the season.

...Junior Terance Mann has led the Seminoles in scoring in three of the first seven games of the season (17 vs. George Washington, 21 against The Citadel and a career-high 25 in Florida State's win over No. 5 Florida).

...Three players – Mfiondu Kabengele (12 against The Citadel), Ike Obiagu (10 against Rutgers) and Phil Cofer (12 against Florida) – have pulled down double figure rebounds in the first seven games of the season;

...Six different players Terance Mann (17 vs. George Washington, 21 vs. The Citadel, 25 at Florida), Mfiondu Kabengele (15 vs. Fordham), M.J. Walker (22 vs. Colorado State), Braian Angola (21 vs. The Citadel) and CJ Walker (24 vs. Rutgers) have led the Seminoles in scoring in the first seven games of the season.

...Phil Cofer became the first Florida State basketball player to finish his career undefeated against Florida.

...Phil Cofer earned the second double double of his career in Florida State's victory over No. 5 Florida. He totaled 10 points and 12 rebounds in Florida State's victory over the Gators on Dec. 4, 2017 and totaled 21 points and 11 rebounds against Pitt on Jan. 14, 2015.

...Phil Cofer is shooting .628 from the field and averaging 16.3 points scored in the last four games. He totaled 21 points against Kennesaw State, 15 against The Citadel, 10 at Rutgers and 10 at Florida. Cofer has scored in double figures in four consecutive games for the first time in his career in each of the last four games.

...Phil Cofer, who made his career-high of four 3-point field goals in Florida State's victory over Rutgers on Nov. 28 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, is shooting .714 from the 3-point line (five of seven) in the last four games.

...Phil Cofer has made as many 3-point shots in the first seven games of the 2017-18 season (six) as he did combined in the last two seasons (six). His six 3-point shots made in the first seven games of the 2017-18 season have already tied his single-season career-high for 3-point shots made in a single season.

...CJ Walker has scored 40 points in his last two games (his career-high of 24 in the Seminoles' victory over Rutgers and 17 at Florida). He is averaging 20.5 points scored per game in his last two games and a career-high 11.9 points scored per game in seven games as a starter in 2017-18.

...CJ Walker is shooting .823 from the free throw line (15 of 17) in the last two games. He made his career-high of 10 free throws on 11 attempts in scoring his career-high of 24 points in Florida State's victory over Rutgers;

...CJ Walker is shooting .556 from the 3-point line (five of nine) in the past two games. He was two of three from the bonusphere for 24 points against Rutgers and was three of six from long range for 17 points against No. 5 Florida.

...CJ Walker has scored in double figures in four of the first seven games of the 2017-18 season. He scored in double figures in three of 33 games as a freshman.

...Trent Forrest is shooting .765 from the free throw line (13 of 17) in the last four games. He was a perfect four of four from the free throw line for eight points against The Citadel and was a near perfect five of six from the line for eight points in the Seminoles' victory over No. 5 Florida.

...Braian Angola leads the Seminoles in both assists (29 / 4.1 apg) and 3-point field goals made (15). He has earned at least two assists in each of the first seven games of the season and has made at least two 3-point field goals in five of the first seven games of the season.

...Braian Angola has made a team-leading 15 3-point field goals in the first seven games of the 2017-18 season. He made 21 3-point field goals in 34 games as a junior in his first season as a Seminole.

...Braian Angola is averaging 13.5 points per game in the last four games with double figure scoring coming in three of those four games. He scored his career-high of 21 points in the Seminoles' victory over The Citadel.

...Freshman Ike Obiagu is Florida State's team leader in blocked shots with 18 and a 2.6 blocked shots per game average. He has blocked at least one shot in six of his first seven career games.

...Freshman Ike Obiagu has blocked 11 shots in the last four games including five in Florida State's victory over Rutgers. ...Freshman Ike Obiagu is tied for fourth in the ACC and is the top ranking freshmen in the ACC with his 2.6 blocked shots per game average. He is one of only two freshmen in the top-10 in blocked shots in the ACC statistics.

...Terance Mann enters Wednesday's game against Loyola shooting .595 from the field for his career. He is ranked third in school history for career field goal shooting percentage.

...Terance Mann is averaging 16.7 points scored per game in the first seven games of the season. He has nearly doubled his scoring average from last season (16.7 from 8.4).

...Terance Mann has scored in double figures in a team-leading six of Florida State's first seven games of the season. He scored in double figures in 15 of Florida State's 35 games as a sophomore and in three of 34 games as a freshman.

...Terance Mann scored his career-high of 25 points in the Seminoles' victory over No. 5 Florida on Monday night. He has scored at least 20 points in three of the last five games and is averaging 17.2 points per game since totaling 20 points in the Seminoles' victory over Colorado State in the championship game of the Jamaica Classic.

...Terance Mann has nine steals this season including seven in the last four games – an average of 1.8 steals per game. He has at least two steals in four of Florida State's first seven games of the season.

...Freshman M.J. Walker is shooting .647 from the 3-point line (11 of 17) and averaging 15.0 points in the three games in which he has scored in double figures (12 vs. George Washington, 22 vs. Colorado State, 11 vs. Kennesaw State).

...Freshman M.J. Walker has made at least one 3-point goal in four of Florida State's first seven games of the season.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennasaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. And he did it from all over the floor -- Cofer threw down a dunk and a handful of layups, was 2 for 2 from the free-throw line and even drained his only 3-point attempt. Braian Angola (17 points, seven rebounds), Terance Mann (13 points), C.J. Walker (12) and M.J. Walker all joined Cofer in double-figures, and the Seminoles shot a season-best 42.3 percent from 3-point range. That includes a 2-of-3 mark from Angola and 3-of-5 effort from M.J. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Mfiondu Kabengele scored 16 points and added 12 rebounds in just 14 minutes of action to lead Florida State to a 113-78 win over The Citadel to improve to 5-0. Kabengele's ability on the glass was evident as the big man with a 7-4 wingspan grabbed five offensive rebounds, often turning those into easy buckets at the rim. On the evening the Noles scored 27 second-chance points, largely contributed to by Kabengele's performance. Fellow big-man Phil Cofer continued his strong stretch of play as he added 15 points, while notching three rebounds in the win. The senior flashed his patented tenacity and ability to create scoring chances at the basket finishing 7 of 9 from the floor on the night. For the Seminoles, Braian Angola and Terance Mann each led the team with 21 points with Angola scoring all his points on shots made beyond the arc, totaling seven on the evening. Mann added a team and career-high

high eight assists in the victory.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. -- CJ Walker scored 24 points and Phil Cofer added 19 to lead unbeaten Florida State past Rutgers 78-73. Walker was 6 of 11 from the floor and made 10 of 11 free throws. Cofer was 7-of-11 shooting and made four 3-pointers. Ike Obiagu grabbed 10 rebounds and chipped in five points for Florida State. Eugene Omoruyi scored 22 points to lead Rutgers (6-1). Corey Sanders added 20 points, and Deshawn Freeman followed up his first double-double of the season with 15 points and 16 rebounds. Freeman energized the crowd when he was fouled by Mfiondu Kabengele, raising his arms several times to get the crowd to its feet with 14:35 remaining. Rutgers went on to take a 44-41 lead after Omoruyi converted the 3-point play and Freeman made a pair of free throws. Walker then scored the next 11 points for the Seminoles, hitting 5 of 7 from the line and a pair of 3-pointers. Trent Forrest made a layup and Florida State led 53-45 with 12:28 to play. The Scarlet Knights pulled to 69-66 after Omoruyi's layup with 1:56 to go, but they didn't get closer.

Phil Cofer Brings A Blue-Collar Mentality, Leadership To Florida State Basketball

Phil Cofer is finally healthy and it shows.

Florida State's 6-foot-8 senior forward has recovered physically from ankle surgery that prematurely ended his sophomore season and mentally with the confidence to believe he can take the pounding of an entire college basketball season.

And on a team of young slashers and shooters, Cofer is the blue-collar glue as the Seminoles have raced out to a 6-0 record.

Entering Monday's game against No. 6 Florida, Cofer is second to Terance Mann in scoring with 14.2 points per game and shooting percentage at .642, is third in rebounding with 4.7 per game and is second among starters with the fewest turnovers (seven).

In his last three games, Cofer is shooting 23 of 31 (.742) and averaging 18.0 points. He's also developed more of an outside game and in the Seminoles' 78-73 victory over Rutgers last Tuesday he connected on 4 of 6 3-point attempts.

Prior to that, Cofer was 2 of 7 from the 3-point arc this season. He attempted only 32 3-points in three seasons before this year, making 12.

"My teammates are getting me the ball in those situations," he said. "We do a lot of drive-and-kick and it's what has been opening up the shots. I've worked on my shooting, a lot of repetition, and it's helped a lot."

But what has helped mainly is that Cofer can run and jump for a full game and not worry about his ankle — or his back and foot, other areas where he has had injury problems during his college career.

After a promising freshman season in which he averaged 6.9 points and 4.5 rebounds, and started the last 24 games of the season, Cofer required surgery in January of 2016 to remove a cyst in his ankle after playing only 11 games as a sophomore.

Cofer played in 32 games last season but averaged only 2.9 points and 1.9 rebounds. FSU assistant coach C.Y. Young, who recruited Cofer, said it was understandable that Cofer was tentative most of the season.

"The entire season, you could see him limping and favoring it," Young said. "He always said it didn't hurt but you could see when he ran he was obviously favoring one side more than the other. It was like he didn't want to put his foot on the ground."

Late in the season, Cofer began to get more confident about the ankle. And Young said the day after the Seminoles were eliminated in the NCAA Tournament in Orlando by Xavier, Cofer was in the gym.

"The next season started for him the day after our last game," Young said. "He was in the gym around the clock. I don't think he took any time off. That's the one thing about Phil, is that you never have to coach effort."

This season, Cofer is pain-free and looking forward to the rest of his senior season.

"Injuries take a toll on anybody," he said. "What's helping me is not dwelling on it. I'm leaving it in the past." Cofer, who played high school basketball at Whitewater High School in Fayetteville, Ga., said he received strong guidance from his parents, former Detroit Lions Pro Bowl defensive end Michael Cofer, and former University of

Tennessee basketball player Reba Cofer. Working hard and playing to win were stressed while being raised by the two elite athletes.

“Being competitive runs in my family,” he said. “Even in little things, like playing games, it’s competitive. My Dad and Mom gave me tremendous support. It kept me going.”

Cofer said some of the most heated games he’s played in were two-on-two basketball in his back yard: he and his brother vs. Dad and Mom.

“Mom still has her jump shot,” Cofer said. “They whipped us a few times before we finally got a little older and bigger.”

Given his parents’ background at Tennessee (his father played for Johnny Majors), Cofer intended to continue that family tradition. But when Cuonzo Martin was fired as the Volunteers coach in 2014, Cofer backed off his verbal commitment and signed with FSU coach Leonard Hamilton.

“Coach Martin and I had a great relationship,” Cofer said. “When he left I decided I had other options. I couldn’t have made a better choice; Coach Hamilton is like another father to me. He thinks of you as a person, not a basketball player. Everything happens for a reason.”

Cofer’s teammates say his leadership will be the glue in whatever success the Seminoles have this season.

“He brings the energy every day,” Mann said. “We all hurt for him when he was injured but he’s playing great now. It’s not just scoring, but all the little things that are important, like defense and rebounding. If he’s not scoring he’s always doing something else to help the team.”

Young offered an example. He said Cofer is a master at help-side defense (covering a man who has beaten his nearest teammate), forcing the offensive player to stop cutting or pick up his dribble, then moving back quickly to guard his man.

“That doesn’t show up in the stat sheet,” Young said. “He does a bunch of little things that don’t, but help us win. He brings an energy, physicality and toughness to this team.”

Young also said Cofer has been a leader from day one.

“He’s gotten that from his parents,” Young said. “Even as a freshman he didn’t hesitate to tell upperclassmen, ‘hey, listen to the coaches ... do your job.’”

It took four years, but Cofer has gone from role player to one of the team’s stars. Young said it’s rewarding to watch.

“Whatever success he has this season, he’s earned it,” Young said. “But for Phil, it will be all about the team success. It’s all he’s ever cared about.”
