SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO SOUTHERN MISS IN FINAL NON-CONFERENCE GAME

No. 24/25 Florida State, which has been included in the national rankings in both of the past two weeks, plays host to Southern Miss on Thursday, December 21, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles' game against the Eagles is their final non-conference regular season game of the 2017 season. The game between the two former Metro Conference foes marks the second consecutive season the two teams have met with the Seminoles taking a 98-49 victory on Dec. 8, 2016 in Tallahassee. Florida State enters Thursday's game with a 26-game home court winning streak – the third longest in the nation and a 26-game non-conference home winning streak – the second longest current streak in the ACC (Duke, 138). Following Thursday's game against Southern Miss, the Seminoles will take time away from the basketball court to celebrate the holiday season with their families and friends. The team will be back in Tallahassee after Christmas Day to begin preparations for No. 4 Duke on December 30, 2017 at 2:00 in Durham for their first ACC game of the season. Beginning with its game against Duke, the Seminoles play 18 consecutive ACC games before participating in the ACC Tournament March 6-10 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SOUTHERN MISS – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State plays host to Southern Miss at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on December 21, 2017. The meeting in Tallahassee marks the 26th meeting between the two teams who were both members of the Metro Conference and met every year from 1983 through 1991. The Seminoles are 11-2 at home against Southern Miss in a series that dates back to the 1951-52 season. Doc Sadler, who is in his fourth season as the head coach at Southern Miss, has been the head coach at four schools – Arkansas-Fort Smith, Texas El-Paso, Nebraska and Southern Miss – and has only coached against Florida State once – last season's 98-49 loss to the Seminoles. Chris Croft, an assistant coach on the Eagles' staff, was an administrative assistant under the famed Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State during the 1997 and 1998 season – Sutton was named the head coach at Oklahoma State after current Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton left the Cowboys to take the head coaching job at Miami. Croft was also a program specialist at Nebraska under Sadler when the Seminoles defeated the Cornhuskers by a 74-60 margin on December 31, 2005 at the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise. Clarence Weatherspoon, also an Eagle assistant, played against Florida State five times (1988, 1990 and 1991) with the Seminoles winning all five games.

FSU PLAYS HOST TO SOUTHERN MISS WITH A 26-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss looking to win their 27th consecutive home game at the Donald L. Tucker Center. It's a winning a streak that ranks as the third longest home court winning-streak in the nation. The Seminoles are 5-0 at home this season (with wins over George Washington, Kennesaw State, the Citadel, Loyola and Charleston Southern), were undefeated at home during the 2016-17 season (18-0) with wins over four ranked teams (No. 7 Duke, No. 12 Louisville, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 21 Virginia Tech) and won their final three home games (against Notre Dame, Syracuse and Davidson in the NIT) to close the 2015-16 season. Florida State's current home winning streak began with a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. The Seminoles began the season with the fifth longest home court winning-streak in the nation. Florida State moved up to fourth with its first three wins of the season and into third when Oregon lost at home to Boise State at home on Dec. 1. The Ducks entered the season with a 46-game home court winning streak. Cincinnati currently holds the nation's longest home winning streak. The Bearcats are home next against Arkansas Pine-Bluff on Tuesday (Dec. 19 at 7:00 p.m.) while SMU Cal Poly, also on Tuesday (Dec. 19, at 7:00 p.m. CST).

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 10-1 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES OFF TO BEST START SINCE ... LAST YEAR

At 10-1, Florida State is off to its best 11-game start the beginning of the 2016-17 season (last year) when the Seminoles also won 10 of their first 11 games. The Seminoles improved to 15-1 in 2016-17 before suffering their second loss of the season. Florida State begins play in its 12th game of a season with a 10-1 record for the fifth time in school history. The Seminoles have been 11-1 five times in school history – most recently during the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICS

Florida State enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss as one of only seven teams nationally with a winning percentage of 90 percent or better. The Seminoles are ranked in the top-35 teams nationally for field goal percentage defense (tied for 12th, .375), blocked shots per game (15th, 6.2 bpg), scoring margin (tied for 17th, +17.4 points per game), steals per game (tied for 21st, 9.0 spg), turnovers forced per game (27th, 17.4) and scoring offense (34th, 83.9 ppg).

FLORIDA STATE SHOOTING WELL FROM THE FIELD

Florida State enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss ranked fifth in the ACC with a team field goal shooting percentage of .494. The Seminoles have shot 50 percent or better from the field in six of their 11 games including a .519 shooting percentage in their victory over Charleston Southern on Monday night in Tallahassee. Florida State's season-high of .576 from the field (.552 in the first half and .600) in the second half) in its victory over Loyola ranks as one of two games during which the Seminoles shot better than 50 percent in both halves of the same game (also Kennesaw State, .549 percent). Florida State shot .483 from the field in finishing with a 26-9 record and last shot better than 50 percent from an entire season during the 1988-89 season when they shot .505 from the field in earning a 22-8 record.

SEMINOLES TIED FOR SECOND IN THE ACC IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Florida State has held each of its last three opponents under 39 percent shooting from the field and enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss tied for second in the ACC with a field goal percentage defense mark of .375. In what has become head coach Leonard Hamilton's most favorite statistic, the Seminoles led the nation in limiting their opponents from the field in both the 2009-10 seasons (.377 percent) and the 2010-11 season (.363). Florida State has limited its last three opponents to a .369 shooting percentage and an average of 60.3 points per game. The 53 points allowed to Tulane and the 58 points surrendered to Charleston Southern are two of the three lowest opponent point totals of the season. Florida State limited Fordham to 43 points in its 67-43 win over the Rams in the first round of the Jamaica Classic.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN TOTAL STEALS

Florida State, which has earned 10 or more steals in five games this season, enters Monday's game against Southern Miss ranked first in the ACC with 99 steals and second in the ACC with a 9.0 steals per game average. The Seminoles are six steals ahead of NC State for the overall lead and one-tenth of a steal per game behind Syracuse for the average steals per game lead in the conference statistics. Florida State has earned nine steals in six of its 11 games and totaled a season-high 12 steals in its wins over Fordham (12 steals, 21 points off of turnovers) and Rutgers (12 steals, 16 points of turnovers in Florida State's 78-73 road win).

FLORIDA STATE'S STEALS IN ITS LAST TWO GAMES...

...Florida State has earned 20 steals (10 in each of his last two games) and averages 10.0 steals per game in their last two games. The Seminoles earned 10 steals against both Oklahoma State and Charleston Southern.

FLORIDA STATE SECOND IN THE ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State has nearly three times as many blocked shots as its opponents in its first three games (68-23) and is ranked second in the ACC in blocked shots with a 6.2 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles have blocked at least seven shots in five different games with their season-high 10 blocked shots coming in their victory over the Citadel (Nov. 24). Florida State has totaled more blocked shots than their opponent in nine of their first 11 games of the 2017-18 season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SOUTHERN MISS – THE LAST GAME

Florida State sank 14 3-pointers in a 98-49 victory over Southern Mississippi on Dec. 6, 2016 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles entered the game 12th in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 3-point percentage at 32.9 percent but converted 48.3 percent from beyond the arc. PJ Savoy led the way with a career-high 27 points and was 7 of 10 from 3-point range. Eddie Davis III led the Golden Eagles (3-4) with 17 points and Cortez Edwards added 11. Southern Miss shot 30.2 percent (19 of 63) from the field. The Seminoles continue to improve on defense. During its four-game winning streak they have held opponents to an average of 56.3 points while holding them to a combined 29.3 percent shooting from the field. Jarquez Smith became the 16th player in school history with 100 career blocks 51 seconds into the game. Smith blocked a 3-point attempt by Michael Ramsey, saved the ball from going out of bounds and then sank a 3-pointer on the ensuing trip down the floor for Florida State's first points. The 6-foot-9 senior forward, who made his first start in two years, had 14 points, two blocks and two steals.

THE JAM WITH HAM WINNERS

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton unveiled the 2017-18 team to the adoring Seminole crowd at the ninth annual Jam with Ham at Tully Gymnasium – complete with a 1980's themed program that included 80's music and Hamilton himself dressed in his best throwback suit blended with a kaleidoscope of colors that certainly drew the loudest cheers of the night. The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

1 Senior Phil Cofer finished his career with an undefeated 4-0 record against rival Florida – the first player in Florida State history to finish his career without suffering a loss to the Gators.

3 Three Seminoles – Braian Angola (Citadel, Loyola and Tulane), Phil Cofer (vs. Kennesaw State, Oklahoma State and Charleston Southern) and Terance Mann (G. Washington, Citadel and Florida) have lead the Seminoles in scoring a team-high three times each.

4 Florida State junior Terance Mann is one of four players in the ACC to rank in the top 20 in the conference statistics in both scoring (14th, 16.1 ppg) and rebounding (20th, 6.4 rpg). Only Mann, Marvin Bagley of Duke, Bonzi Colson of Notre Dame and Oshae Brissett of Syracuse are ranked in the top 20 of both categories.

5 Junior Terance Mann has scored in double figures in a team-leading and career-best five consecutive games. He is averaging 17.0 points per game since scoring his career-high of 25 points in Florida State's victory over then No. 5 Florida in Gainesville (Dec. 4).

5 Florida State has trailed by no more than five points in its first 11 games. The Seminoles trailed George Washington (by two points), Fordham (by one), Colorado State (by three), Rutgers (by four, twice), Florida (by one), Oklahoma State (by five) and Charleston Southern (by four).

5 Freshman Ike Obiagu is ranked first among freshmen in the ACC and fifth among freshmen nationally with his 2.64 blocked shots per game average. He is ranked 21st in nation overall in blocked shots.

6 Sophomore Trent Forrest tied his career-high with six assists in the Seminoles' game against Oklahoma State on Saturday in Sunrise. It marked the fourth time in his career that he earned six assists in a game – with six coming against Nicholls State as a freshman and six coming against Colorado State, Kennesaw State and Oklahoma State as a sophomore.

8 Freshman Ike Obiagu has at least one blocked shot in each of the last eight games (22 blocks/2.8 bpg) and has at least one blocked shot in 10 of the first 11 games of his career.

9 Florida State has earned nine of its 10 wins this season by double figures with its largest win (+35 points) coming in its 113-78 win over the Citadel (Nov. 24). The Seminoles' closest margin in a victory has been +5 in its 78-73 win over Rutgers (Nov. 28) in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

10 Florida State is undefeated, 10-0, when it outscores its opponent.

177 Junior Terance Mann has already scored as many points in the first 11 games of the 2017-18 season (177, 16.1 ppg) as he did in 34 games as a freshman (177, 5.2 ppg).

FLORIDA STATE OUTSCORING ITS OPPONENTS FROM ALL OVER THE COURT

Florida State enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss ranked fourth in the ACC in both scoring offense (83.9 ppg) and scoring margin (+17.4 ppg). The Seminoles have outscored their opponents by more than 17 points per game by winning the scoring battles from 2-point range (by an average of 12.4 points per game), from 3-point range (by an average of 3.3 points per game) and from the free throw line (by average of 1.7 points per game). The Seminoles have outscored their opponent in 21 of the 22 halves of basketball they have played this season.

COFER BLAZING HOT FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Senior Phil Cofer, who made his career-high of five 3-point field goals in the Seminoles' game against Oklahoma State on Saturday at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla., enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss as one of the hottest 3-point shooters on the planet. He has made six of his last 10 3-point field goal attempts and is shooting a career-high .480 from distance. Cofer has already made as many 3-point field goals this season in 11 games (12) as he made in the first three seasons and 76 games of his career (12).

COFER IN THE LAST TWO GAMES...

...Is averaging 20.5 points scored per game (he scored his career-high of 22 points against Oklahoma State) while shooting .538 from the field (14 of 26), .600 from the 3-point line (six of 10) and .875 from the free throw line (seven of eight).

MANN IS DOUBLING HIS SCORING FUN

Junior Terance Mann enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss ranked 14th in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 16.1 points per game scoring average. He entered his junior season averaging 6.8 points per game and has more than double his scoring average through the first 11 games of the 2017-18 season. Mann is averaging 9.3 points scored per game MORE than he did as a freshman and sophomore.

Junior Terance Mann enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss shooting .597 from the field for his career including shooting a career-high .647 from the field during the 2017-18 season. He trails only Murray Brown (1977-80, .668 career field goal shooting percentage) and Bernard James (2011-12, .627 career field goal shooting percentage) in the Seminoles' record book for career field goal shooting.

WALKER AND FORREST IN THE TOP 10 IN THE ACC FOR STEALS

Sophomores CJ Walker (ninth, 1.73 spg) and Trent Forrest (tied for 10th, 1.70 spg) are the only teammates ranked in the ACC's top 10 for steals. The Seminoles have four players with double figures for steals through the first 11 games and are led by Walker's near career-high 19 thefts. Forrest, who led Florida State in steals as a freshman, has at least three steals in four different games this season including his season and career-high of four in Florida State's victory over Tulane at Amalie Arena in Tampa (Dec. 10).

OBIAGU IN THE ACC STATISTICAL RANKINGS

Freshman Ike Obiagu enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss as Florida State's leader in blocked shots with 29 and a 2.6 blocked shots per game average. He blocked three shots against Charleston Southern and has more blocked shots by himself (29) than Florida State's first 11 opponents combined (23). Obiagu is ranked third in the ACC statistics and is the only freshman in the league ranked in the top seven for blocked shots.

ANGOLA AMONG FLORIDA STATE'S LEADERS IN STEALS

Senior Braian Angola is ranked second among his Seminole teammates with 18 steals and a career-high 1.6 steals per game average. He has more steals in fewer games (18-11) this season as a senior than he did last season as a junior (15-34) and earned his career-high of four steals in Florida State's victory over Colorado State in the second round of the Jamaica Classic. Angola has earned nine steals in the last four games including three each in victories over Tulane (Dec. 10) and Charleston Southern (Dec. 18).

ANGOLA'S INCREASED SCORING

Senior Braian Angola has scored in double figures in more than half of Florida State's first 11 games of the season (six of 11) and has increased his scoring average by more than seven points per game (+7.3) this season as compared to his junior season.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. MONTEGO BAY, Jamaica — Redshirt freshman Mfondu Kabengele scored 15 points and pulled down nine rebounds and junior Terance Mann scored 14 points and pulled down five rebounds to lead Florida State to a 67-43 victory over Fordham at the Montego Bay Convention Centre in the Jamaica Classic. Kabengele and Mann were the only two Seminoles in double figure scoring as the Seminoles utilized a suffocating defense that limited the Rams to 12 made field goals and a .231 field goal shooting percentage while blocking nine shots and recording 12 steals. Florida State's height advantage and ball-hawking defense was on display from the opening tip as they scored took their first double digit lead

at 19-9 with 7:43 remaining in the first half. The Seminoles increased their lead to 20 at the 16:01 mark of the second half (40-20) and led by as many as 28 (50-22) with just over 10 minutes remaining. Feeling Healthy Again, Phil Cofer A Big Contributor To Florida State's Early Season Success

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Phil Cofer is finally making an impact for 19th-ranked Florida State.

The 6-foot-8 senior forward is healthy for the first time in a while and has been one of the main contributors behind the Seminoles' 9-0 start. He has been in the starting lineup for every game this season, averaging 12.3 points and 5.8 rebounds.

Cofer was limited the past two seasons due to ankle and back injuries, but he said this past summer was the first time he has felt completely healthy since his freshman season.

"Injuries are always going to take a mental toll, but the coaches have told me to play my game and not dwell on the past," Cofer said.

Cofer came to Florida State as a physical power forward who could also play some at center. As a freshman he started 24 games and was second on the team in rebounding (4.5 per game) while averaging 6.9 points.

But injuries would diminish his production the next two seasons. He started only five games while averaging 3.2 points and 2.0 rebounds.

Despite seeing limited minutes, Cofer continued to work on ball handling and improving his perimeter shooting. That work has paid off this season as he is making 55 percent of his shots from the field, including 6 of 15 3-pointers.

"Where some guys are always looking for reasons why they aren't being as successful and use excuses that is not the case with him," coach Leonard Hamilton said. "Even when he was hurt he was working on his game and studying our system. He has confidence in his shooting now that when he has the open look he can knock it down."

Going into Saturday's game against Oklahoma State, which is part of the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Cofer is averaging 13.8 points and 6.7 rebounds during the past six games along with hitting 56.9 percent from the field. His best game during that stretch came in the Dec. 4 win at then-No. 5 Florida when Cofer had his second career double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds.

Cofer, who had scored in double figures only seven times in 76 games the first three years of his career, has six this season.

The Seminoles switch in offensive philosophy has also meant Cofer has had to change his game. Florida State has evolved from a motion offense that relies on strong inside play to a team that is more up-tempo with versatile perimeter players, Cofer has refined his game to where he can play both small and power forward.

"This summer I was on the treadmill a lot more because of the way we play," he said. "I've been getting the ball more but also have been getting a lot of open shots. With an unselfish team like we have and this offense, it has been great so far."

Cofer and the Seminoles have also bought into Hamilton's philosophy of having to win by committee. Florida State returned only one starter from a team that went 26-9 last season and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in five years, but it can tie its best start in school history with a win on Saturday.

The Seminoles will host Charleston Southern on Monday and Southern Mississippi on Thursday before opening Atlantic Coast Conference play at Duke on Dec. 30.

Even though Florida State has been the conference's surprise team so far, Hamilton is trying to keep expectations in check.

"Our attitude and effort is good but still have some technique errors," he said. "We still have a ways to go. We need to attack defenses better and move the ball better."
