SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO TAMPA TO TAKE ON TULANE IN HERITAGE INSURANCE CLASSIC

Florida State, one of nine undefeated teams remaining in college basketball, travels to Tampa and the Amalie Arena to play Tulane on Sunday, Dec. 10 at Noon. The game will be televised on ESPNU. Florida State is 8-0 for the first time since the 2003-04 season when they won their first 10 games of the season and are 8-0 for the fourth time in school history (2017-18, 2003-04, 1988-89, 1977-78). The Seminoles have improved to 9-0 just once in school history – when they won the first 10 games of the 2003-04 under then second-year head coach Leonard Hamilton. Florida State’s game against Tampa renews a series that has been played since the 1966-67 season and thrived the Seminoles (1976-91) and Green Wave (1975-85 and 1989-2013) were members of the Metro Conference. Florida State left the Metro Conference for the ACC for the 1991-92 season with the Seminoles winning the conference championship in 1991 before joining the ACC. The Seminoles enter Sunday’s game against Tulane looking to win their third game of the week with victories coming at No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4, 83-66) and at home against Loyola (Md.) (Dec. 6, 96-71). Following Sunday’s game against Tulane and a break for the semester exam period, the Seminole will play Oklahoma State in the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Fla. on Dec. 16. The Seminoles close out the fall semester with home games against Charleston Southern (Dec. 18, 7:00 p.m.) and Southern Miss (Dec. 21, 2:00 p.m.)

FLORIDA STATE VS. TULANE – CONNECTIONS

Florida State will play Tulane on December 10, 2017 at the Amalie Arena in Tampa on December 10, 2017. The ACC Tournament was played the Amalie Arena in 2007, where North Carolina emerged as the tournament champion. The Seminoles and the Green Wave will meet for the 36th time but for the first time since December 5, 1995, when both teams were members of the Metro Conference. The Seminoles lead the all-time series by a 23-12 margin and have won six of the last eight games played between the two teams. The Green Wave is coached by Mike Dunleavy, Sr. Dunleavy, a 17-year veteran coach of the NBA. As the general manager of the Los Angeles Clippers, he drafted former Seminole All-American Al Thornton with the 14th pick in the 2007 NBA Draft. Dunleavy played and graduated from South Carolina in 1976 but never played against the Seminoles during his collegiate career as the Gamecocks didn’t join the Metro Conference until the 1980-81 season.

FLORIDA STATE AND TULANE AS METRO CONFERENCE TEAMS

Florida State and Tulane played as members of the Metro Conference from the 1976-77 season through the 1984-85 season and then again during the 1989-90 and 1990-91 seasons. The Seminoles earned a 15-9 record against Tulane as members of the Metro Conference.

FLORIDA STATE AS ONE OF EIGHT REMAINING UNDEFEATED TEAMS

Florida State is one of eight undefeated teams remaining in Division I college basketball as of Dec. 8, 2017. The Seminoles are joined by Arizona State (7-0), Duke (11-0), Georgetown (7-0), Miami (8-0), Mississippi State (7-0), TCU (9-0) and Villanova (9-0) as the undefeated Division I teams entering this weekend’s slate of games.

FLORIDA STATE’S VICTORY OVER NO. 5 FLORIDA

The Seminoles’ 17-point win at No. 5 Florida on Tuesday is Florida State’s most lopsided true road victory against an AP Top-25 team in the school’s ACC era (since the 1991-92 season). It’s previous largest margin of victory over a nationally ranked team was 65-51 also at Florida, then No. 25 on Nov. 23, 2007.

MANN IS THE NATION’S TOP GUARD FOR FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE

Junior Terance Mann enters Sunday’s game against Tulane as the No. 1 ranked guard in the nation in field goal shooting percentage (.651). He is ranked 25th nationally in field goal shooting percentage and first among all guard in the country. Mann is the only guard in college basketball shooting 65 percent from the field or better.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Tulane and improve its record to 9-0 to open the 2017-18 season. The last time the Seminoles were 9-0 was to open the 2003-04 season when they won their first 10 games of the season.

...Defeat Tulane and run its winning streak to nine games – marking the second consecutive season the Seminoles have won at least nine consecutive games. The Seminoles won 12 consecutive games (Nov. 25, 2016 through Jan. 7, 2017) last season in its way to a 26-9 overall record and a 12-6 mark (second place) in the ACC;

...Defeat Tulane and win its fourth consecutive game against Tulane in games played on a neutral court. The Seminoles defeated the Green Wave in the second round of the 1993 NCAA Tournament, 94-63, in Orlando.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 8-0 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES ADD TO TROPHY CASE

Florida State's championship in the inaugural Jamaica Classic was the fifth for the Seminoles under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and first since the Seminoles won the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer classic during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles most memorable championship title under Hamilton came at the 2012 ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles' championship at the Jamaica Classic was the 16th title in an in-season championship in school history.

MANN AND M.J. WALKER NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM AT JAMAICA CLASSIC

Junior Terance Mann (17.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman M.J. Walker (11.0 ppg, 1.5 spg) were both named to the Jamaica Classic All-Tournament team as the Seminoles took home the championship of the event with victories over Fordham (67-43, Nov. 17) and Colorado State (90-73, Nov. 19, 2017). For Mann and Walker, it marked the first time both players had been named to an all-tournament team during their collegiate careers.

SEMINOLES' M.J. WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman guard M.J. Walker, a consensus top-25 high school player in 2017, is on the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award watch list as named by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Walker is the 12th McDonald's All-American in Florida State history. He is one of two true freshmen and one of five players from the ACC on the 2018 Jerry West Award watch list.

SEMINOLES RANKED AMONG ACC LEADERS IN SCORING MARGIN

Florida State, which has won four of its eight games by 20 points or more, enters Sunday's game ranked fourth in the ACC with a +20.2 average margin of victory. The Seminoles have earned on win by 35 points (Nov. 24, 113-78 vs. the Citadel), one by 25 points (Dec. 6, 91-76 vs. Loyola (Md)), and two by at least 20 points (Nov. 14, 87-67 vs. George Washington and Nov. 17, 67-43 vs. Fordham). The Seminoles' closest win (+5) came in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge against Rutgers in Piscataway, N.J.

SEMINOLES GUARDING THE 3-POINT SHOT

Florida State enters Sunday's game ranked second in the ACC in 3-point field goal percentage defense and has helped its first eight opponents to a .282 mark from the bonusphere. Only Miami, which is holding its opponent to a .257 mark from long range is defending the 3-point line better than the Seminoles. The Seminoles are ranked 21st nationally in 3-point field goal defense category. Florida State has been especially stingy in the last two games as it held No. 5 Florida and Loyola to a combined mark of .209 from the 3-point line.

SEMINOLES HEATING UP FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State is shooting .841 from the free throw line and missed only seven total free throws in their victories over Florida and Loyola. The Seminoles' .833 mark (vs. Florida) and their season-high .850 mark (against Loyola) ranks as their two best free throw shooting performances of the season. Florida State has shot .750 percent or better from the free throw line in four of their first eight games (all victories) of the season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. TULANE – THE LAST GAME

Tulane's Jerald Honeycutt made a 3-point shot with one second remaining in the game to lead Tulane to a 78-77 win over Florida State on Dec. 5, 1995 in a game played at the Louisiana Superdome. Honeycutt corralled a loose ball on the baseline and threw up an improbable shot that went through the basket at the buzzer to stun the Seminoles. Honeycutt totaled a team-high 18 points to lead four of his teammates in double figure scoring. James Collins led Florida State with 28 points as the loss dropped the Seminoles to 3-1 on the young season. Collins was one of four Seminoles who finished in double figure scoring along with Avery Curry (13 points), Kirk Luchman (12) and Randell Jackson (10). LaMarr Greer led the Seminoles with 12 assists. Florida State led the game, 40-39, at halftime, but were outscored by a 39-37 margin in the second half. Tulane shot .509 from the field and made six 3-point shots. Florida State shot .482 from the field and made nine 3-point shots. The Seminoles outrebounded Tulane by a 37-27 margin.

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton unveiled the 2017-18 team to the adoring Seminole crowd at the ninth annual Jam with Ham at Tully Gymnasium – complete with a 1980's themed program that included 80's music and Hamilton himself dressed in his best throwback suit blended with a kaleidoscope of colors that certainly drew the loudest cheers of the night. The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.857 Sophomore Trent Forrest is shooting .857 from the free throw line (six of seven) in the last two games. He made five of six free throws in scoring nine points in Florida State's victory over Florida.

.875 Senior Phil Cofer has made seven of his last eight free throws (.875) since the second half of the Seminoles' victory over Rutgers.

.917 Senior Braian Angola is shooting .917 from the free throw line (11 of 12) since the second half of Florida State's victory over Kennesaw State. He was a perfect four of four from the line in scoring 10 points in Florida State's victory over Florida on Dec. 4 in Gainesville.

2.6 Sophomore CJ Walker has earned an average of 2.6 steals per game in each of the last five games (13 total steals).

2.8 Freshman Ike Obiagu has blocked 14 shots in the last five games for a 2.8 blocked shots per game average.

3 Florida State is one of three remaining undefeated teams in the ACC entering Sunday's game against Tulane.

4 Florida State overcame a four-point deficit on three different occasions in the first half to defeat Rutgers by a 78-73 margin in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The four-point deficits were the Seminoles' largest of the season.

5 Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele enters Sunday's game against Tulane having made five consecutive free throws. He made his final free throw in scoring nine points against Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and was a perfect four of four from the free throw in scoring six points in Florida State's victory over Loyola on Wednesday night in Tallahassee.

7 Freshman M.J. Walker enters Sunday's game against Tulane having made seven consecutive free throws. He has not missed a free throw attempt since the second half of Florida State's season-opening victory over George Washington (Nov. 14).

8 Florida State is undefeated, 8-0, when it outscores its opponent.

9 Florida State has blocked at least nine shots in three different games – nine against Fordham, nine against Loyola and 10 against the Citadel. The Seminoles enter Sunday's game against Tulane averaging 6.3 blocked shots per game – an average of 1.2 more blocked shots this season as compared to the 2016-17 season.

21 Freshman Ike Obiagu, who ranks third in the ACC with a 2.6 blocked shots per game average, has blocked more shots by himself (21) than the Seminoles' first eight opponents combined (19).

42 Junior Terance Mann has started 42 of the last 43 Florida State games in the last two seasons. The only game he didn't start came on Senior Day on March 4, 2015 against Miami.

HAMILTON'S VICTORIES OVER TOP 5 RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's 83-66 victory over No. 5 Florida was the 11th victory by the Seminoles over a top-five ranked team during the Leonard Hamilton era at Florida State (2003-Pr). The Seminoles' victory over the No. 5 Gators marked the Seminoles' second true road victory over a top-five ranked team (under Hamilton) and first since they won at Cameron Indoor Stadium over then No. 4 Duke, 76-73, on Jan. 21, 2012.

BACK TO THE JUNKYARD DOG DEFENSE COVETED BY COACH HAMILTON

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Tulane as the only ACC team ranked in the top five in the conference statistics for 3-point field goal percentage defense (2nd, .282), blocked shots (2nd, 6.3 bpg), steals (3rd, 8.8 spg), field goal percentage defense (4th, .377). The Seminoles' defensive numbers bring back memories of Florida State's best defensive teams under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton when the Seminoles led the ACC and the nation in field goal percentage defense in both 2010 (.377) and 2011 (.363).

FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING DEFENSE

Florida State has made it a habit during the early part of the 2017-18 season to hold its opponent below its scoring average at the time of the game. The Seminoles have limited each of their last four opponents to a combined average of 72.0 points scored per game. Florida State held No. 5 Florida, who entered the rivalry game on Monday night as the nation's top ranked scoring team with a 99.5 points per game scoring average, to 66 points – more than 33 points below its scoring average. The Seminoles held the Gators to a .362 field goal shooting percentage (on 21 made field goals), a .240 3-point field goal shooting percentage (on six made 3-point field goals) and to a (at the time) season-low 66 points.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116,

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. Game 4 -- Florida State 98, Kennesaw State 79

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. And he did it from all over the floor -- Cofer threw down a dunk and a handful of layups, was 2 for 2 from the free-throw line and even drained his only 3-point attempt. Braian Angola (17 points, seven rebounds), Terance Mann (13 points), C.J. Walker (12) and M.J. Walker all joined Cofer in double-figures, and the Seminoles shot a season-best 42.3 percent from 3-point range. That includes a 2-of-3 mark from Angola and 3-of-5 effort from M.J. Walker, the freshman who has scored at least 11 points in three of his first four games. The Seminoles needed less than five minutes to claim their first double-digit lead, and that advantage ballooned to 25 points when Angola finished off a three-point play early in the second half. Senior guard James Scott led Kennesaw State with 17 points, 15 of which came in the second half.

Braian Angola Prospers For Colombian National Team

After moving away from his family in Villanueva, Colombia nearly seven years ago, Florida State's senior guard Braian Angola found his way back to his home country this past summer.

Born and raised in Colombia, Angola grew up with his two sisters Michel and Karol. Chasing opportunity, Angola immigrated by himself to the United States at the age of 14, where he would go on to attend Findlay Prep in Henderson, Nevada. Separated from his family at such a young age, Angola frequently visited and maintained his ties to home.

"It has been really hard just because it is my family. I love my mom and little sisters," Angola says. "When my dad passed away, I became the male figure of my house."

Prior to transferring to Florida State, Angola played his first two years of college ball at Northern Idaho College. In his second year, he earned NJCAA All-American honors and led the Cardinals to the second round of the NJCAA Tournament.

During his sophomore campaign, Angola averaged nearly 21 points, seven rebounds and four assists per game while shooting an encouraging 52 percent from the field. It was his impressive career at Northern Idaho that ultimately caught the attention of FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton.

"Coach Ham, the way that he coaches and the way that he talked to me about what he wanted to with the team," Angola says. "It encouraged me to come here and be a part of that change."

And he surely contributed quite significantly to what many Seminoles fans consider one of the best seasons in program history.

Appearing in 34 of Florida State's 35 games last season, Angola averaged nearly five points, two rebounds and one assist per contest with a .420 three-point shooting percentage. The Colombia native made a lasting impact on the Seminoles' run in the ACC Tournament, scoring a season-high 17 points during his impressive outing against Notre Dame.

With such high expectations set forth after a brilliant regular season, Florida State's year concluded with a frustrating 91-66 loss to Xavier in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

"We had such a good team and the potential to make it to the Elite Eight or the Final Four," Angola explained. "It was just one of those days that nothing was going for us. We were just trying to be a brotherhood and support each other."

With his first season competing at the Division 1 level under his belt, Angola returned to Colombia to represent his country in the FIBA Americup Tournament. As the standout player on Colombia's national team, Angola averaged just shy of 13 points, six rebounds and two assists per game throughout the tourney.

"I was really proud in myself because when I was younger, I always wanted to represent my country," Angola says. "When I went back and saw all the support that the country gives us, they were enjoying watching us play."

Yet, what really caught Angola's attention was the difference in play style when comparing international basketball to college basketball. The increased physicality in his teammates and competitors as well as the speedier pace of game were what stood out considerably when Angola took his play abroad.

“When you play for the national team, there are a lot of people that are playing for their jobs,” Angola says. “Money changes everything, it changes your mentality because now you have to take care of your family and yourself.”

Up ahead for Angola and the Seminoles is another seemingly promising season. Despite the departure of Xavier Rathan-Mayes, Dwayne Bacon and Jonathan Isaac, several new additions were made to the team to ensure another winning season for the men’s basketball program.

“We have a good chance to make it back to the tournament and win the ACC title. We have a lot of new players and players from last year that people didn’t really know,” Angola concludes. “We really care about each other. We are always talking about how we want to be brothers even after basketball.”
