SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO NO. 24 MIAMI ON SATURDAY IN TALLAHASSEE

Florida State, which has won two straight and three of its last four ACC games, plays host to No. 24 Miami on Saturday, Jan. 27, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles and the Hurricanes met earlier this season with Miami taking an 80-74 victory at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables. Florida State enters its game against Miami fresh from its 88-77 win over Georgia Tech on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles were led by junior All-ACC Candidate Terance Mann who scored his career-high of 30 points in the victory. Florida State enters Saturday's game having won two of the last three meetings against Miami including the last game played in Tallahassee. Florida State took a 66-57 win in Tallahassee on March 4, 2017. Following the Seminoles' game against Miami, they will travel to play their only game of the season against Wake Forest as they travel to play at Winston-Salem on Wednesday, Jan. 31 at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum.

SUPER-MANN EXPLODES FOR 30 – NOW IN THE TOP 10 IN THE ACC IN SCORING

Junior Terance Mann scored his career-high of 30 points in Florida State's 88-77 victory over Georgia Tech on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. His scoring outburst moved him into seventh place in the ACC in scoring and made him one of only eight players ranked in the ACC's top 25 for scoring (seventh) and rebounding (22nd). His career-best 30-point scoring night moved him from 13th place in the ACC in scoring (15.3 ppg) to seventh in scoring in the nation's toughest conference (16.1 ppg). Mann is one of only seven players in the ACC who is averaging better than 16 points per game. Mann became the first Seminole to score 30 points in a game since Xavier Rathan-Mayes totaled 30 against North Carolina on Jan. 4, 2016. He became just the 23rd player in school history to score 30 or more points in an ACC game. Mann's 21 first half points against the Yellow Jackets ranks as the best single half scoring effort of his career and is tied for fourth on his own personal list of most points scored in a game.

UNIQUE TRIPLE FOR MANN AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Junior Terance Mann led the Seminoles in scoring (30 points), rebounds (five) and assists (five) as he turned in one of the most complete performances of any ACC player this season against Georgia Tech on Wednesday. Combined with his 30 points and five assists, Mann accounted for 41 of Florida State's 88 points (.466 percent) including 29 total points on 21 points scored and eight more on four assists in the first half.

ANGOLA CONTINUES HIS SCORING STREAK

Senior Braian Angola scored 19 points in Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech to mark the eighth straight ACC game (every FSU conference game this season) that he has scored in double figures. Angola enters Saturday's game against Miami ranked 19th in the ACC in overall scoring (14.6 ppg) and fourth in the ACC in scoring in conference games only with an 18.9 points per game scoring average. He has scored in double figures in nine consecutive games against ACC opponents and is averaging 18.7 points scored since totaling 17 in the Seminoles' game against Notre Dame in the semifinals of the 2017 ACC Tournament at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.

SEMINOLES FACE ANOTHER RANKED OPPONENT IN MIAMI

With two wins against nationally ranked teams already this season (No. 5 Florida, Dec. 4, 83-66 and No. 11 North Carolina, Jan. 3, 81-80), Florida State faces its fifth ranked opponent of the season as it welcomes Miami to the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State has nine wins over nationally ranked teams in their last 44 games dating to its 83-78 victory over then No. 21 Florida on Dec. 11, 2016. During that stretch of games, the Seminoles are 31-13 (.705 winning percentage) overall and 16-10 (.615 winning percentage) in ACC regular season games. Florida State is scheduled to play four more games against teams ranked nation's top 25 (one against Miami, one against Virginia and two against Clemson). The Seminoles have been nationally ranked for five weeks the season.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and win its season-high third consecutive ACC game. The Seminoles most recently strung together a series of ACC wins with multiple game of consecutive conference wins during the 2016-17 season (4 games, 3 games 2 games and 2 games);

...Defeat Miami and win its third game of the season against a nationally ranked team. The Seminoles have victories over No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4, 83-66) and No. 11 North Carolina (Jan. 3, 81-80) on their resume;

...Defeat Miami and raise its record in Tallahassee against the Hurricanes to 27-8 (.771 winning percentage);

...Defeat Miami and win its 16th game of the season. It would mark the second consecutive season the Seminoles would have earned 16 overall wins before the end of the month of January. The Seminoles won their 16th game of the 2016-17 season with an 88-72 win over Duke on Jan. 10, 2017 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 272 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 15-5 (2017-18).

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME

Florida State is 9-1 at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center this season with three ACC wins (No. 11 North Carolina, Syracuse and Georgia Tech) and six non-conference wins (George Washington, Kennesaw State, the Citadel, Loyola (Md.), Charleston Southern and Southern Miss). The Seminoles have won 30 of their last 31 home games since defeating Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami having won 15 of their last 16 home ACC games with one of those wins coming against Miami (March 4, 2017, 66-57).

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FIELD IN THE LAST TWO GAMES

Florida State has shot a combined .563 from the field (63 of 112) and averaged 89.5 points per game in the last two games. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Miami ranked third in the ACC in team field goal percentage with a .474 mark and are ranked behind only Virginia Tech (.518) and Duke (.510). The Seminoles are one of only five teams in the ACC shooting 47 percent or better from the field for the season.

SEMINOLES' HOT SHOOTING AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Florida State shot .593 from the field in scoring 88 points in its victory over Georgia Tech on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' .593 mark from the field (32 of 54) ranks as the 10th best for a single game in their ACC history. Florida State's school record field goal percentage for a single game in ACC play is .661 against Clemson in its 109-61 win over the Tigers in Tallahassee on Feb. 5, 2017.

SEMINOLES ALSO SHOOTING WELL FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State has shot 70 percent or better from the free throw line in each of their last four games including a season-high .889 against Boston College. The Seminoles made nearly 83 percent of their free throws in Wednesday's win over Georgia Tech. Florida State is shooting .772 percent from the line and averaging 17.6 made free throws in the last five games.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Chris Lykes scored a season-high 18 points and helped Miami withstand a late rally from No. 24 Florida State to win 80-74 at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables on Jan. 7, 2018. Lykes finished 6 for 10 from the field, including a pair of 3-pointers and baskets on two acrobatic drives. Florida State cut a 16-point second-half deficit to four with 24 seconds left. Braian Angola then made a backcourt steal but missed a 3-pointer that would have left the Seminoles trailing by one. Bruce Brown made five of six free throws in the final 45 seconds and finished 12-for-14 at the line. Angola had 16 points and five steals for Florida State.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. And he did it from all over the floor -- Cofer threw down a dunk and a handful of layups, was 2 for 2 from the free-throw line and even drained his only 3-point attempt. Braian Angola (17 points, seven rebounds), Terance Mann (13 points), C.J. Walker (12) and M.J. On the evening the Noles scored 27 second-chance points, largely contributed to by Kabengele's performance. Fellow big-man Phil Cofer continued his strong stretch of play as he added 15 points, while notching three rebounds in the win. The senior flashed his patented tenacity and ability to create scoring chances at the basket finishing 7 of 9 from the floor on the night. For the Seminoles, Braian Angola and Terance Mann each led the team with 21 points with Angola scoring all his points on shots made beyond the arc, totaling seven on the evening. Mann added a team and career-high

high eight assists in the victory.

Different Paths For Walker, Kabengele Lead To Similar Freshmen Impact At Florida State

Florida State guard M.J. Walker and forward Mfiondu Kabengele have both made big impacts for the Seminoles this season.

But the similarities end there for the two freshmen.

Walker was a McDonald's All-American and a five-star, or high four-star, prospect that averaged 27.8 points per game as a senior.

He had offers from UCLA, Kansas, Memphis, and West Virginia -- among his 11 total offers -- but chose to come play for the Seminoles.

Now Walker is averaging 8.1 points per game and coming off the bench.

"It's different," Walker said.

"I was used to starting and everything, but I had to understand and be mature enough to know that I'm a freshman. I'm playing under guys that have been here and know the system well.

"I had to learn the system. Learn the principles defensively and offensively. It's different. I feel like I'm adjusting and still learning and it's definitely been a road for me."

Then you have Kabengele -- the 270th overall prospect in the 2016 recruiting class by the 247Sports composite rankings -- who only had offers from Boston College, Georgia, Binghamton, St. Louis, and St. Bonaventure.

He was making the transition from guard to forward after going through a growth spurt, and that hindered his progress when it came to earning more offers.

"Junior year summer, I was about 6-foot-4 and I became 6-foot-7, and I changed from a wing to a forward," Kabengele said.

"That was the biggest change for me. I was always a physical guard so when I grew into a big there wasn't that much change."

Walker has had his moments this season where he's shown flashes of brilliance -- he's scored in double figures in seven of FSU's 19 games and scored 22 points against Colorado State and 24 against Virginia Tech -- but he's also had four games where he hasn't scored at all.

"When my shots not falling, I try to do whatever I can defensively," Walker said.

"I was hot last game and it kind of came to me. I just fed off that energy. You have those games where you're hot or you're not... I feel like defense creates offense. That's what my high school coach preached. That's just how I've played my game my whole life...

"Even if you're having an off night, you can always control how hard you play on defense. So that's what I try to keep in my mind when I play."

One of the reasons that Walker averages nearly 20 minutes a game is because of the tenacious defense that he plays. FSU coach Leonard Hamilton has praised Walker's effort on defense consistently since his arrival.

"How many times do you see freshmen that come in and really get after you and defend you with the effort that he gives?" Hamilton said.

FSU redshirted Kabengele during the 2016-2017 season.

"Mfiondu is still growing," Hamilton said.

"That's why we have the knee braces on him... When we were evaluating him, we realized that his best basketball was still ahead of him. That's why we redshirted him. He's still learning, but he's playing off of instincts. He plays with such passion and reckless abandon, and he's extremely competitive and physical."

As a redshirt, he was put on the scout team and was forced to guard No. 5 overall pick in the 2017 NBA Draft Jonathan Isaac, or second round pick Dwayne Bacon during practice.

It gave him an appreciation for the speed of the game and how to play at the college level, and he's used that knowledge to carve out a role in FSU's defense this year playing as a forward as well, as the center position after junior Christ Koumadje went out with a foot injury.

He's averaging 8.3 points and 5.3 rebounds per game this season.

"The more games that I play in the ACC, I feel like I'm kind of getting the pace of the game, the way the referees are going to officiate the game, and what I can do and what I can't do," Kabengele said.

"Just waiting for my spots to be aggressive and being observant on the court."
