NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES RETURN HOME TO PLAY HOST TO TAR HEELS

Florida State, which won its first nine game of the season and moved into the national rankings on December 11, plays host to No. 12/11 North Carolina in its ACC home opener on Wednesday, Jan. 3, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2. The Seminoles enters Wednesday's game with a school-record 27-game home court winning streak – the third longest in the nation behind only Cincinnati (34 straight home court victories) and SMU (33 straight home court wins). Included in Florida State's winning streak are 12 consecutive victories over ACC opponents as the Seminoles won their final three conference home games of the 2015-16 season and all of their nine conference home games during the 2016-17 season. After playing (and winning) six non-conference home games to begin the 2017-18 season, the Seminoles play North Carolina in their first ACC home game of the season. Following Wednesday's game against North Carolina, the Seminoles travel to play their third consecutive ranked ACC team as they travel to play at No. 14/14 Miami in Coral Gables, Fla. on Sunday night at 6:00 p.m. That game will be televised by ESPNU and will be the Seminoles third consecutive nationally televised game.

FSU PLAYS HOST TO NORTH CAROLINA WITH A 27-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against North Carolina looking to win their 28th consecutive home game at the Donald L. Tucker Center. It's a winning a streak that ranks as the third longest home court winning-streak in the nation. The Seminoles are 6-0 at home this season (with wins over George Washington, Kennesaw State, the Citadel, Loyola, Charleston Southern and Southern Miss), were undefeated at home during the 2016-17 season (18-0) with wins over four ranked teams (No. 7 Duke, No. 12 Louisville, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 21 Virginia Tech) and won their final three home games (against Notre Dame, Syracuse and Davidson in the NIT) to close the 2015-16 season. Florida State's current home winning streak began with a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. The Seminoles began the season with the fifth longest home court winning-streak in the nation. Florida State moved up to fourth with its first three wins of the season and into third when Oregon lost at home to Boise State at home on Dec. 1. The Ducks entered the season with a 46-game home court winning streak. Cincinnati currently holds the nation's longest home winning streak. The Bearcats are home next against SMU on Jan. 7 at 6:00 p.m. while SMU next plays host to Temple on Jan. 10 at the 8:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 270 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 11-2 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES CLOSE OUT A SUCCESSFUL 2017 CALENDAR YEAR

Florida State earned a 24-9 record (.727 winning percentage) during the 2017 calendar year. The Seminoles won 13 games in January, February and March 2017 and earned 11 wins in November and December 2017. The Seminoles defeated six nationally ranked opponents in 2017 including No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, 2017 in Gainesville.

SEMINOLES OVER 90 POINTS AGAINST DUKE

Florida State scored 93 points in its game against Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium on Saturday. It marked the third time in their last 11 ACC games that the Seminoles had scored 90 or more points. Florida State scored 109 in a victory over Clemson on Feb. 5, 2017 and 104 in a win over Boston College on Feb. 20, 2017. Florida State's 93 points against the Blue Devils marked the 16th time in its ACC history the Seminoles had scored 93 or more points in a single game.

FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against North Carolina ranked third in the ACC in scoring with an 85.7 points per game scoring average. The Seminoles have scored more than 90 points in both of their last two games and have totaled 90 or more points in six of their first 13 games of the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles are averaging 80.9 points per game in the last three seasons after not averaging more than 76.7 points in during the first 13 seasons of the Leonard Hamilton era at Florida State. The Seminoles averaged 66.6 points scored per game during the 2014-15 season and have increased their scoring average by more than 14 points as compared to that average in the last three seasons. The Seminoles' 85.7 points per game scoring average is their highest since their 1998-99 team averaged 91.3 points per game in advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Florida State has led each of its first 13 games at halftime and has won all but two halves in its first 13 games of the season. The Seminoles led the Blue Devils by a 49-45 margin at the intermission on Saturday in Durham. The Seminoles' largest halftime lead was a 47-21 advantage (+26 points) in its victory over Southern Miss (Dec. 21) while its smallest halftime lead was a 36-35 advantage (+1) against Rutgers.

SEMINOLES HOT FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against North Carolina ranked second in the ACC with 123 3-point field goals made and sixth in the ACC with a .387 shooting mark from long range. The Seminoles are averaging 17 made 3-points field goals and are shooting .500 from distance in their last two games. Florida State's 19 3-point shots made against Southern Miss was only one made 3-point field goal from tying the school record of 20 which was set against Maine of Dec. 8, 2007. The Seminoles' 15 3-point shots made against Duke on Saturday are tied for the third most in an ACC game and were the most since making 17 3-point shots in their 109-61 victory over Clemson on Feb. 5, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State's 15 made shots from distance tied the school record for most 3-point shots made in a road ACC game – the Seminoles also made 15 from long range at North Carolina in Feb. 21, 2004.

SEMINOLES FROM THE 3-POINT LINE IN THE LAST TWO GAMES

In its last two games, Florida State has made a total of 68 field goals (37 in its win over Southern Miss and 31 against Duke) with 34 of the 68 coming from the 3-point line. The Seminoles are shooting .507 from 2-point range (34 of 67) and .500 from 3-point range (34 of 68) in the last two games. Overall the Seminoles are shooting .504 from the field (68 of 135) and averaging 95.5 points scored in the last two games.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State has made 34 3-point shots more and is shooting more than 10 percentage points higher from the 3-point line than its opponents. The Seminoles' 123 3-point shots made rank second in the ACC to only Virginia Tech which has made 132 3-point shots.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH CAROLINA – THE LAST GAME

Joel Berry II scored 26 points and No. 11 UNC snapped No. 9 Florida State's school-record win streak with a 96-83 victory on Jan. 14, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Justin Jackson and Isaiah Hicks each added 22 points for the Tar Heels who led just 82-78 with 5:25 left before putting together a 14-2 run. The Tar Heels finished with a 56-34 rebounding advantage with 21 offensive boards, helping them to 25 second-chance points in a rebounding effort FSU coach Leonard Hamilton described as "relentless." That fit right into an attacking mindset that got the Tar Heels to the line 37 times. Jonathan Isaac had 17 points and 12 rebounds for the Seminoles.

Health, Hard Work, Right Mentality Help Cofer Make 'Unreal' Jump

TALLAHASSEE -- Phil Cofer became accustomed to watching everyone around him find success. The Florida State forward was a vocal cheerleader from the bench who quietly waited for his chance – when he would be healthy again and ready to show what he could offer.

Cofer went into his senior year focused on improving his weaknesses, refined his ball-handling and jump shot.

“All the hard work in the offseason,” Cofer said. “I went straight into the gym. I pretty much have been grinding and grinding.”

Cofer began an intense offseason in the days after FSU was eliminated from the NCAA Tournament in March. He was in the gym working on jumpers and post moves, 3-pointers and dribbling.

The texts to assistant coaches Charlton Young and Stan Jones were frequent, with Cofer wanting to know when either would be available for a late-night session in the gym.

“Everything he’s got going right now, he earned it,” Young said. “He has a pro’s type of mentality to the game. The jump he has made is unreal.”

The months of hard work have paid off. After battling through injuries as a sophomore and then averaging just 2.9 points a game as a junior, Cofer has become a go-to player for FSU (11-1), scoring in double figures in eight of FSU’s 12 games.

The senior forward is averaging 13.4 points per game and 5.5 rebounds per game through the non-conference schedule and has made contributions on the offensive and defensive end of the court for the Seminoles, who begin the ACC schedule on Saturday at No. 3 Duke (12-1) at 2 p.m.

“His commitment to becoming a better perimeter player has been huge for us,” Young said. “Now he’s another guy, a big at 6-8, that can dribble, pass and shoot and make a decision. Now he’s turned himself into a stretch 4.”

While Cofer was a starter as a freshman in 2014-15, his career detoured due to foot injuries the following year.

And Cofer was often viewed as a reserve that could provide defense and energy in quality minutes off the bench during his junior season.

But Cofer has been one of the most pleasant surprises of the 2017-18 season for FSU. He has made 13 three-pointers – already one more than he had in his first three seasons combined. He has also scored in double-figures in eight games this season after doing that just seven times in his prior 76 games.

“We have all known all along that he had the potential to be a high contributor,” FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said. “He’s been slowed by some injuries. He has tremendous character. He has good genes. You’re just seeing the maturity level of a guy growing, improving. Not only has he performed at a high level, he has given tremendous leadership.”

Cofer has led with his intensity on both ends of the floor. While he’s had nights where he didn’t score as many points, Cofer has made his mark as a rebounder, defender and leader.

And Cofer's accuracy from the floor (55 percent) and the free-throw line (75 percent) is also 10 points higher than his averages coming into the year. Coaches who have seen Cofer play a few times now are taken by surprise at the improvement in his game.

"He's a terrific long defender on film and in person," Charleston Southern coach Barclay Radebaugh said. "He's expanded his game so that he's efficient from the perimeter, both ways. I've seen his game grow in person. Because we've played Florida State play so many times, I've seen his game grow."

Cofer says his success this season hasn't surprised him. He's credited his teammates with supporting him along the way, encouraging him during the down times.

It's clear that Cofer doesn't like to discuss the injuries much. After one game in November, he said he "came a long way" and on Thursday he said that his focus is to "keep moving forward."

While he is playing to prove doubters wrong, his positive mind-set has helped him achieve a stunning start in what has been a career season. And the Seminoles have taken notice of the results from his hard work.

"Phil worked very hard over the summer and in the preseason, getting himself healthy, working on his game," guard Trent Forrest said. "Now it's just manifested for him."
