NO. 23 SEMINOLES HOST SYRACUSE IN SATURDAY BATTLE IN TALLAHASSEE

No. 23 Florida State, which has been nationally ranked in each of the last five weeks, plays host to Syracuse on Saturday, January 13, 2018 at 2:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have won 28 of their last 29 home games with one of those 28 wins coming over Syracuse. Florida State defeated the Orange by a 78-73 margin on March 5, 2016 – the last time Syracuse played in Tallahassee. The Seminoles enter Saturday’s game against the Orange with a 12-4 overall record a 7-1 mark in games played at home and have won 13 of their last 14 ACC games played in the Tucker Center. The Seminoles have lost only once at home since defeating No. 23 Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. Following Saturday’s game against Syracuse, the Seminoles travel to play at Boston College on Monday, Jan. 15 at 7:00 p.m. That game will be televised nationally on ESPN.

SEMINOLES WELCOME BACK ALUMNI PLAYERS ON SATURDAY

Head coach Leonard Hamilton, his staff and players welcome a special group of Florida State alumni legends for the Inaugural FSU Basketball Alumni Legends competition at halftime of Saturday’s game against Syracuse. The Seminoles welcome home eight players and two coaches in school history for a first-of-its-kind skills competition. The players – Randy Allen (1984-87), Terrell Baker (1988-89), Harry Davis (1975-78), Greg Grady (1973-76), Eugene Harris (1974-77), Ron King (1971-73), Michael Polite (1988-91) and Charlie Ward (1991-94) along with coaches Al Lawson and FSU Hall of Famer Hugh Durham – will participate in a free throw shooting contest, a big man challenge and a 3-point shooting competition. The exhibition will take place at halftime of Florida State’s game against Syracuse.

SEMINOLES’ MANN ENJOYING AN ALL-ACC SEASON

Florida State junior forward Terance Mann, who scored his ACC career-high of 25 points in Florida State’s game against Louisville on Wednesday night in Tallahassee is enjoying one of the top seasons of any player in the league and is a bonafide All-ACC Candidate. Mann enters Saturday’s game among the ACC leaders in scoring, rebounding and field goal percentage shooting while leading the Seminoles in each of those three categories -- scoring (career-high 15.1 ppg), rebounding (career-high 6.2 rpg) and field goal shooting (.615). Mann’s 25 points against Louisville marked his career high scoring total for an ACC game and tied his career-high (he also totaled 25 points in Florida State’s win over No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, 2017). His scoring marked the career-high fifth time he has scored at least 20 points in a game this season. Mann has now scored at least 20 points in six different career games – five as a junior and one as a sophomore.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 271 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 12-4 (2017-18).

HAMILTON NEEDS ONE ACC WIN TO TAKE OVER EIGHTH PLACE IN LEAGUE HISTORY

With the Seminoles' victory over No. 12 North Carolina on January 3 in Tallahassee, Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton moved into a tie for eighth place in the ACC's all-time career wins list for ACC Games (regular season and ACC Tournament). He moved into a tie with Duke legend Vic Bubas with 128 career ACC wins. Entering Saturday's game against Syracuse, Hamilton needs one win to move into sole possession of eighth place for ACC wins in league history.

SEMINOLES WITH A REBOUND ADVANTAGE

Florida State has won the rebound battle in its last two games against both Miami (+12) and Louisville (+11). The Seminoles advantage has come on the offensive side of the floor as they won the offensive battle of the boards against the Hurricanes (21-5) and the Cardinals (19-13). Their advantage on the boards has allowed them to hold a sizeable advantage on second chance points in both games. Florida State totaled its season high of 23 offensive rebounds in its victory over then No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, in Gainesville. The Seminoles won the 2nd chance points battle by a 24-8 margin in winning the game 83-66.

FLORIDA STATE GUARDING ITS OPPONENTS

Florida State is ranked fifth in the ACC with a .390 field goal percentage defense mark – its best mark since limiting their opponents to a .399 mark during the 2014-15 season. Under Leonard Hamilton, Florida State led the ACC and the nation in both 2009-10 (.377 field goal defense mark) and 2010-11 (.363 field goal defense mark) and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both seasons.

SEMINOLES LEAD ACC IN 3-POINT FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE

Florida State, which has made 58 3-point field goals in its last five games, enters Saturday's game against Syracuse ranked first in the ACC in shots made from distance with 147 and a 9.2 3-point field goals made per game average. The Seminoles are averaging nearly three made 3-point field goals per game more this season as compared to the 2016-17 season (9.2 – 6.7).

ANGOLA MOVES INTO ACC'S TOP 25 FOR SCORING

Senior Braian Angola, who has scored in double figures in each of the last four games, enters Saturday's game against Syracuse ranked 24th in the ACC in scoring with his ever-growing and career-high 13.6 points per game scoring average. He is averaging 19.3 points scored per game in his last four games and scored his career-high of 23 points in Florida State's ACC opener against Duke (Dec. 30) and totaled 20 points in the Seminoles' victory over No. 12 North Carolina (Jan. 3) in Tallahassee. Angola has scored in double figures in 10 of Florida State's first 16 games of the 2017-18 season.

MANN CONTINUES TO BE A FIXTURE IN ACC'S TOP 25 FOR SCORING AND REBOUNDING

Junior Terance Mann, who is enjoying the best season of his Seminole career, enters Saturday's game against Syracuse tied for 17th in the ACC in scoring with his career-high 15.1 points per game scoring average and 24th in the ACC in rebounding with his career-high 6.2 rebounds per game scoring average. He has been a fixture in the ACC's scoring leaders list after averaging 17.0 points and scoring in double figures in each of the first five games of the season. Mann has kept his scoring average above 15.0 points per game throughout the season and has averaged more than 6.0 rebounds per game since pulling down his career-high of 14 rebounds against Oklahoma State in the Orange Bowl classic on Dec. 16.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SYRACUSE – THE LAST GAME

Andrew White scored 24 points, John Gillon had 21 points and 11 assists, and Syracuse upset No. 6 Florida State 82-72 on Jan. 28, 2017 at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse. Syracuse won its second straight close game and gained its first victory over a ranked team. After Dwayne Bacon's third 3-pointer cut Syracuse's lead to 72-70 with 1:48 left, the speedy Gillon got more aggressive, repeatedly driving the lane. He hit a layup to extend the lead to four and then made eight straight free throws in the final minute to help the Orange hold on. Jonathan Isaac also had 19 points for the Seminoles, and Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 16. Rathan-Mayes' 3 got Florida State within four with 4:08 left in the game, but Syracuse held on from there.

.800 Freshman M.J. Walker is shooting .800 from the Free throw line (four of five) in the last six games. He was a perfect two of two from the line against Louisville on Wednesday.

.842 Sophomore Trent Forrest is shooting .842 from the free throw line in the last five games (16 of 19). He made a career-high eight of 10 free throws in Florida State's game against Miami on Sunday.

.850 Junior PJ Savoy, who is tied for 13th in school history with a .376 career mark from the 3-point line has scored .850 percent of his points (57 of 67) this season from the 3-point line. He has made 19 3-point shots for 57 points, four 2-point field goals for eight points and two free throws for two points this season.

2.7 Senior Braian Angola enters Saturday's game against Syracuse with a 2.7 steals per game average in his last three games. He totaled a career-high five steals against Miami.

Junior Christ Koumadje, who missed 11 games (Nov. 22 through Jan. 3) with an injury, returned to the Seminoles' rotation at Miami and has certainly made his presence known in his first two games back from injury. He is averaging 6.5 points, 8.5 rebounds and is shooting .545 from the field in games against Miami and Louisville. Koumadje has pulled down 17 rebounds – 11 on the offensive end of the court – in 35 minutes of play in the two games since his return.

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. Seven different Seminoles hit a three on the night, a stark contrast from a season ago when the team ranked near the bottom of the ACC in three-point shooting and percentage. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Florida State's Terance Mann's Versatility Makes Him Key Cog For FSU; Draws Comparisons To Michael Carter-Williams

Growing up in New England, Terance Mann gained a reputation for doing a little bit of everything on the basketball court. About five years before him, NBA player and former Syracuse star Michael Carter-Williams gained a similar reputation on the same courts.

While participating in the Boston Amateur Basketball Club program, Carter-Williams vaulted to national prominence. When Mann was in the program and Carter-Williams visited as an alumnus, the teenager gained an appreciation for the then-Syracuse guard's game.

Mann's favorite player as a middle schooler quickly became Carter-Williams, even before the eighth grader was nationally recruited.

"I loved how he did a lot," Mann said, "...and how his process (to the NBA) came about."

Seven years later, the junior's versatility has catapulted him to become Florida State's most valuable player. With the departure of last season's top-two leading scorers, Dwayne Bacon and Jonathan Isaac, Mann has had to redefine his game and vocalize his leadership, assistant coach Charlton Young said. The all-new Mann will be on display as the No. 23 Seminoles (12-4, 1-3 Atlantic Coast) host the Orange (12-5, 1-3) on Saturday.

Mann shouldn't struggle against Jim Boeheim's 2-3 zone because "he shoots the gaps and finds his spots in close," Young said.

"He's almost unselfish to a fault," Young said, "If you gave him the option to put up 40 points on a team or have a complete game, say 13 rebounds, nine assists and four blocks, he would choose the latter every time. I don't know a lot of kids that would say the same."

But more than just numbers, his willingness to take on numerous roles helps his team win on any given day, senior Phil Cofer said.

His desire to be versatile originates from his mother, Daynia La-Force. La-Force, who is the head coach of the University of Rhode Island's women's basketball team, molded her son to affect every aspect of the game, Mann said, because she desires that in all of her players.

"I didn't want to pigeonhole his game," La-Force said, "but he would hear me complain about or compliment players on my team and he would learn from that."

It started by accompanying his mom on road trips when she coached at Long Island University. Mann learned how to count by shouting the numbers on the back of basketball jerseys and while on team buses, he would always hang around his mother's players.

La-Force emphasized that Mann learned what kind of basketball player he wanted to become from being around the sport his whole life. Before and after every game, Mann always talks to her, La-Force said, and she offers him advice.

La-Force noticed the potential talent of her son the moment she saw him, as just an eighth grader, dunk for the first time. As La-Force started to realize her son's talents, she reached out to Young, then the head coach at Georgia

Southern, for advice. The two had once met at a Black Coaches & Administrators conference, and have been in contact ever since.

“I became his protection,” Young said, “His mom was hard on him, so I just told (Mann) to keep doing what he was doing.”

Young credits Mann for rejuvenating Florida State’s basketball program back in 2015. The No. 86 high school recruit in his class, according to ESPN, Mann was the first Seminole commitment in his class and helped convince players like Bacon and Malik Beasley to come to FSU.

Mann called Bacon and Beasley and pitched winning as an emphasis. It was his willingness to reach out to other top-tier players that helped lead his team to becoming a contender in the ACC, Young said.

This season more than ever, Mann has stepped up for the Seminoles. He’s increased his numbers in every statistical category across the board and his 61.5 percent mark from the field leads all ACC guards. When the Seminoles played then-No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, Mann poured in 25 points along with eight rebounds to lead FSU to its first upset win of the season.

With three years of college experience under Mann’s belt, Young and Leo Papile, a former scout for the Boston Celtics and the founder of BABC, believe there’s a chance he can reach the heights of his childhood favorite player.

“You have to compare them,” Papile said. “Physically, (Mann’s) playing at the same level as (Carter-Williams).”
