SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT VIRGINIA TECH ON SATURDAY

Florida State, which has earned true road wins at both Florida and Rutgers this season, travels to play its fourth ACC road game of the season at Virginia Tech on Saturday, Jan. 20, 2018 at 12 Noon. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2. The Seminoles enter Saturday’s game against Virginia Tech with two consecutive wins over the Hokies – both during the 2016-17 season – with one coming in the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Jan. 7, 2017; 93-78) and one coming in the ACC Tournament at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn (March 8, 2017; 74-68). In traveling to play on the road at Virginia Tech, the Seminoles are playing their fourth ACC road game in their first seven conference games and second consecutive away from the Donald L. Tucker Center after playing at Boston College on Monday night. Following Saturday’s game at Virginia Tech, the Seminoles play host to Georgia Tech (Jan. 24) and Miami (Jan. 27) before venturing back out on the ACC road for two consecutive conference games.

SEMINOLES’ HAMILTON IN THE ACC’S TOP 10 FOR HOME AND ROAD WINS

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton, who ranks eight in ACC history for both overall wins (295) and ACC wins (129), enters Saturday’s game at Virginia Tech as one of only seven coaches in ACC history ranked in the ACC’s top 10 for both home court and road victories. Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 77 home ACC wins (sixth in ACC history) and 41 true road ACC wins (ninth in ACC history).

HAMILTON NEARING ACC’S TOP 7 FOR OVERALL VICTORIES

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday’s game against Virginia Tech ranked eighth in school history with 129 total ACC wins (regular season and ACC Tournament). He needs only 10 victories to move in to a tie for seventh play in ACC history with Lefty Driesell of Maryland.

SEMINOLES’ MANN ENJOYING AN ALL-ACC SEASON

Florida State junior forward Terance Mann, who scored his ACC career-high of 25 points in Florida State’s game against Louisville on Jan. 10 in Tallahassee, is enjoying one of the top seasons of any player in the league and is a bonafide All-ACC Candidate. Mann’s 25 points against Louisville marked his career high scoring total for an ACC game and tied his career-high (he also totaled 25 points in Florida State’s win over No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, 2017). Mann scored 21 points against Boston College to mark the career-high sixth time he has scored at least 20 points in a game this season. Mann has scored at least 20 points in seven different career games – six as a junior and one as a sophomore.

ANGOLA WITH DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING IN SEVEN STRAIGHT ACC GAMES

Senior Braian Angola, who Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton calls the best defensive guard in the ACC, has scored in double figures in seven consecutive games against ACC opponents and is averaging 19.3 points per game in those seven games. He has scored in double figures in each of the Seminoles’ six ACC games this season and scored 17 against Notre Dame in the semifinals of the 2017 ACC Tournament.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 272 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 13-5 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES SHOOTING WELL FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Led by Terance Mann's perfect five of five shooting performance from the free throw line, the Seminoles shot a season-high .889 from the free throw line against Boston College on Monday night. It marked the fourth time this season (also in wins over Florida, Loyola (Md.) and Southern Miss) that the Seminoles had shot better than 80 percent from the free throw line in a single game. Florida State is shooting a combined .754 percent from the free throw line in its last three games as compared to shooting .664 from the line in its first 15 games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC FROM THE BONUSHPERH

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Virginia Tech ranked first in the ACC in 3-point field goals made per game with a 9.1 per game average. The Seminoles have made at least five 3-point field goals in each of their 18 games and have made at least 11 in seven of their 18 games. The Seminoles are ranked No 1 in the ACC this season after ranking No. 13 in the ACC with a 6.7 3-point field goals made per game average during the 2016-17 season.

LOOKING INSIDE THE SEMINOLES' REBOUNDING NUMBERS

Florida State has significantly improved its rebounding numbers in its last four games – four games that coincide with the return of junior Christ Koumadje to the Seminoles' lineup. The Seminoles have nearly doubled their offensive rebounding numbers while increasing their total rebounding numbers by more than seven per game. The Seminoles have earned 50 rebounds in both of its last two games against Syracuse and at Boston College – the first time in their ACC history that they have pulled down 50 or more rebounds in consecutive ACC games. Florida State's 50 rebounds against Syracuse and Boston College marked just the fifth and sixth times in its ACC history that the Seminoles pulled down 50 rebounds in a game. The Seminoles' ACC record for rebounds in a conference games is 56 against Maryland on Dec. 19, 2004 – the last time before its recent games against Syracuse and Boston College that Florida State pulled down 50 or more rebounds in an ACC game.

FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA TECH – THE LAST GAME

Dwayne Bacon scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half and No. 16 Florida State defeated Virginia Tech, 74-68, in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament on March 8, 2017 at the Barclays Center. The Seminoles finished the game with 18 offensive rebounds and 16 second chance points. Freshman Jonathan Isaac added 11 points and 12 rebounds for Florida State which outrebounded the Hokies by a 45-31 margin and outscored them by a 42-20 margin in the paint. Sophomore Terance Mann totaled 11 points including a tie-breaking 3-pointer with 8:49 left in the Seminoles' decisive surge late in the game. Florida State benefitted from second-half runs of 13-0 and 18-1 to take control of the game. Zach LeDay led the seventh-seeded Hokies with 22 points and nine rebounds but Florida State seized control of the game when he went to the bench with four fouls in the second half. Seth Allen scored 17 points.

Florida State's Terance Mann's Versatility Makes Him Key Cog For FSU; Draws Comparisons To Michael Carter-Williams

Growing up in New England, Terance Mann gained a reputation for doing a little bit of everything on the basketball court. About five years before him, NBA player and former Syracuse star Michael Carter-Williams gained a similar reputation on the same courts.

While participating in the Boston Amateur Basketball Club program, Carter-Williams vaulted to national prominence. When Mann was in the program and Carter-Williams visited as an alumnus, the teenager gained an appreciation for the then-Syracuse guard's game.

Mann's favorite player as a middle schooler quickly became Carter-Williams, even before the eighth grader was nationally recruited.

"I loved how he did a lot," Mann said, "...and how his process (to the NBA) came about."

Seven years later, the junior's versatility has catapulted him to become Florida State's most valuable player. With the departure of last season's top-two leading scorers, Dwayne Bacon and Jonathan Isaac, Mann has had to redefine his game and vocalize his leadership, assistant coach Charlton Young said. The all-new Mann will be on display as the No. 23 Seminoles (12-4, 1-3 Atlantic Coast) host the Orange (12-5, 1-3) on Saturday.

Mann shouldn't struggle against Jim Boeheim's 2-3 zone because "he shoots the gaps and finds his spots in close," Young said.

"He's almost unselfish to a fault," Young said, "If you gave him the option to put up 40 points on a team or have a complete game, say 13 rebounds, nine assists and four blocks, he would choose the latter every time. I don't know a lot of kids that would say the same."

But more than just numbers, his willingness to take on numerous roles helps his team win on any given day, senior Phil Cofer said.

His desire to be versatile originates from his mother, Daynia La-Force. La-Force, who is the head coach of the University of Rhode Island's women's basketball team, molded her son to affect every aspect of the game, Mann said, because she desires that in all of her players.

"I didn't want to pigeonhole his game," La-Force said, "but he would hear me complain about or compliment players on my team and he would learn from that."

It started by accompanying his mom on road trips when she coached at Long Island University. Mann learned how to count by shouting the numbers on the back of basketball jerseys and while on team buses, he would always hang around his mother's players.

La-Force emphasized that Mann learned what kind of basketball player he wanted to become from being around the sport his whole life. Before and after every game, Mann always talks to her, La-Force said, and she offers him advice.

La-Force noticed the potential talent of her son the moment she saw him, as just an eighth grader, dunk for the first time. As La-Force started to realize her son's talents, she reached out to Young, then the head coach at Georgia

Southern, for advice. The two had once met at a Black Coaches & Administrators conference, and have been in contact ever since.

“I became his protection,” Young said, “His mom was hard on him, so I just told (Mann) to keep doing what he was doing.”

Young credits Mann for rejuvenating Florida State’s basketball program back in 2015. The No. 86 high school recruit in his class, according to ESPN, Mann was the first Seminole commitment in his class and helped convince players like Bacon and Malik Beasley to come to FSU.

Mann called Bacon and Beasley and pitched winning as an emphasis. It was his willingness to reach out to other top-tier players that helped lead his team to becoming a contender in the ACC, Young said.

This season more than ever, Mann has stepped up for the Seminoles. He’s increased his numbers in every statistical category across the board and his 61.5 percent mark from the field leads all ACC guards. When the Seminoles played then-No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, Mann poured in 25 points along with eight rebounds to lead FSU to its first upset win of the season.

With three years of college experience under Mann’s belt, Young and Leo Papile, a former scout for the Boston Celtics and the founder of BABC, believe there’s a chance he can reach the heights of his childhood favorite player.

“You have to compare them,” Papile said. “Physically, (Mann’s) playing at the same level as (Carter-Williams).”
