NO. 10 SEMINOLES BACK AT HOME AGAINST SOUTHEAST MISSOURI MONDAY AT 7:00 P.M.

Florida State, which is ranked No. 10 in both major national polls, plays host to Southeast Missouri on Monday, December 17, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' game against the Redhawks marks their first home game since defeating Troy, 83-67, on December 3. Florida State enters its game against Southeast Missouri having won three consecutive games with victories over Purdue (November 28, 73-72, in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge), against Troy (December 3, 83-67) and over UConn in the Never Forget Tribute Classic in Newark, N.J. (December 8, 79-71). Florida State's game against Southeast Missouri is its first of four games (three at home and one in Sunrise, Fla.) before its begins ACC play at No. 3/6 Virginia (January 9 in Charlottesville, Va.) Following Monday night's game against Southeast Missouri, the Seminoles will play host to North Florida (December 19, 7:00 p.m.) and close out their fall semester at the Orange Bowl Classic against St. Louis IN Sunrise, Fla. (December 22).

FLORIDA STATE VS. SOUTHEAST MISSOURI – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State plays host to Southeast Missouri on Dec. 17, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee in the second ever meeting between the Seminoles and the Redhawks. The Seminoles defeated Southeast Missouri, 100-75, on December 22, 1994 at the Tucker Center in the only previous meeting between the two teams. Southeast Missouri is coached by Rick Ray – who has coached against the Seminoles at both Mississippi State and Clemson. He was the head coach at Mississippi State from 2013-15 and coached the Bulldogs' win over the Seminoles by a 62-55 score in Starkville on Jan. 2, 2015. He was the associate head coach at Clemson for two seasons (2011 and 2012) and was 2-2 with the Tigers against Florida State. Adam Gordon, an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri, was with Ray three years at Mississippi State and their two years at Clemson.

SEMINOLES RETURN TO NATIONAL TOP-10 FOR THE SECOND TIME IN THREE SEASONS

Florida State enters Monday's game against Southeast Missouri ranked No. 10 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. It marks the second time in the last three seasons the Seminoles have been ranked in the nation's top-10. The Seminoles were ranked No. 9 in the AP poll during the week January 9, 2017, No. 10 during the week of January 16, 2017 and No. 6 during the week of January 23, 2017. Florida State was ranked No. 10 during the week of January 9, 2017 and No. 6 during the week of January 23, 2017 in the Coaches poll. The Seminoles have been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in a total of 27 weeks since the 1969-70 season.

FLORIDA STATE ENTERS MONDAY'S GAME WITH AN 8-1 RECORD

Florida State enters Monday's game against Southeast Missouri with three consecutive wins, a 2-0 record in the month of December, two wins against nationally ranked opponents (then No. 19/21 LSU and then No. 19/19 Purdue) and an 8-1 record. Florida State was 9-0 to open the 2017-18 season and 10-0 to open the 2003-04 season under 17th-year Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME SINCE THE START OF THE 2015-16 SEASON

Florida State enters Monday night's game against Southeast Missouri with 35 wins in its last 37 games played in the Donald L. Tucker Center during the 2016-17 (a perfect 18-0 record), 2017-18 season (13-2 record) and 2018-19 (4-0 record).

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME IN NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

Florida State is at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center with 29 consecutive non-conference wins on their home course since the beginning of the 2014-15 season. The Seminoles' winning streak against non-ACC teams began with a 96-73 win over UCF on December 6, 2014.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Southeast Missouri and win its 30th consecutive non-conference home game. The Seminoles are 37-1 (.974 winning percentage) at home on non-ACC games since the beginning of the 2014-15 season;

...Defeat Southeast Missouri and raise its record to 9-1. It would mark the fourth consecutive season Florida State will have earned at least nine wins before ACC play begins;

...Defeat Southeast Missouri and gain a victory over a team from the state of Missouri for the second time in two seasons. The Seminoles defeated Missouri, 67-54, in the first round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament.

SEMINOLES IN THE POLLS

Florida State has defeated two teams (No. 19/21 LSU and No. 18/19 Purdue) which were nationally ranked in the polls at the time of the games.

FLORIDA STATE GOING TO THE GLASS

Florida State outrebounded UConn by a 38-37 margin in its victory over the Huskies to mark the eighth time in its first nine games of the season the Seminoles have outrebounded its opponent. The Seminoles outrebounded Canisius (November 19) by 15 rebounds, LSU (November 23) by 13 rebounds and Troy (December 3) by 11 rebounds to record double figure rebounding margins three times in the first nine games of the season. Florida State enters Monday's game against Southeast Missouri ranked fifth in the ACC with a +6.6 rebounds per game margin. The Seminoles ranked fourth in the ACC with +2.7 rebounds per game margin during the 2017-18 season.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Florida State made 10 3-point shots in its 83-67 victory over Troy (December 3). It marked the second time this season the Seminoles made at least 10 3-point field goals after opening the season with 11 3-point field goals made in their 81-60 win over Florida. Florida State enters Monday's game shooting .355 from the 3-point line and averaging 7.3 made 3-point shots per game in the first nine games of the season.

SEMINOLES DEFENDING OPPONENTS SHOTS AT THE BASKET

Florida State has limited its last three opponents to an average of 70 points and a .415 shooting mark from the field. The Seminoles held UConn to a .377 shooting mark and 71 points in their 79-71 win over the Huskies – the third time this season they have held their opponent under 40 percent shooting from the field. Florida State also held UAB to a .370 field goal shooting percentage and limited UAB to an opponents' season low .328 mark from the field in the quarterfinals of the AdvoCare Invitational.

FLORIDA STATE AT HALFTIME

Florida State has led at halftime in each of their first eight wins of the season and in eight of their nine games this season. The Seminoles have led by double figures at halftime in four of their nine games (Florida, Canisius, UAB and Purdue) and have yet to lose after leading at the intermission.

FLORIDA STATE'S BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State tied its season-high with five blocked shots in its victory over UConn. The Seminoles also blocked five shots in their season-opening win over UAB in the quarterfinals of the AdvoCare Invitational (November 23). Florida State has blocked at least one shot in all nine of its games this season.

FLORIDA STATE'S STEALS

Florida State tied its season-high with 11 steals in its 79-71 victory over UConn in the Never Forget Tribute Classic on Saturday night. It marked the second time this season (also in their win over 79-76 overtime win over LSU) that the Seminoles totaled 11 steals in a game. Florida State is averaging 8.7 steals and 19.3 points off turnovers in its last three games. The Seminoles earned a season-high 27 points off of turnovers in its 83-67 win over Troy (December 3).

FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC FREE THROW SHOOTING LEADERS

Florida State enters Monday's game against Southeast Missouri ranked third and is one of only four teams in the ACC that is shooting better than 75 percent from the free throw line. The Seminoles' 167 free throws made through their first nine games ranks seventh in the league behind only Louisville (239 free throws made), Pitt (195), Boston College (178), Syracuse (177), Notre Dame (171) and North Carolina (170). Florida State is averaging 18.6 made free throws per game – the third highest per game average in the ACC behind Louisville (22.1 free throws made per game) and Boston College (199).

FLORIDA STATE BY THE NUMBERS...

...Florida State has earned double figure offensive rebounds in five of its eight wins with its season-high of 22 offensive rebounds coming in its overtime win against LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational. The Seminoles outscored the Tigers 12-6 on second chance points including 3-0 on second chance points in the game-determining overtime period. Florida State totaled eight offensive rebounds in outscoring LSU 11-8 to win the game, 79-71, in overtime;
 ...The Seminoles have earned 20 steals in his last two games – an average of 10.0 spg – with 11 coming in its win over UConn and nine coming in its victory over Troy;
 ...Led by Mfiondu Kabengele (seven double figure scoring games) a total of eight Seminoles have scored in double figures at least once in the first nine games of the season. M.J. Walker (five times), Trent Forrest (five times), P.J. Savoy (four times) and Terance Mann (four times) have also scored in double figures multiple times. Mann leads the Seminoles in scoring and is the only Seminole with multiple 20 point scoring games (21 at Tulane and 20 vs. UConn).
 ...Led by Terance Mann (two double figure rebounding games) a total of three Seminoles have pulled down double figure rebounds at least once this season. Mann (twice; 12 vs. LSU, 10 at Tulane) is joined by Trent Forrest (11 vs. UAB) and Christ Koumadje (11 vs. UConn) as the Seminoles' top three rebounder this season;
 ...Terance Mann is one of eight current ACC players who has scored 1,000 or more career points.
 ...Terance Mann (1,009 career points and 537 rebounds) is one of only two current players in the ACC with at least 1,000 career points scored and at least 500 rebounds (also Luke Maye of North Carolina with 1,000 points and 666 rebounds);
 ...Christ Koumadje is ranked third among all current ACC players with 106 career blocked shots. He is one of only three ACC players with at least 100 career blocked shots (Paschal Chukwu of Syracuse, 123 and Elijah Thomas of Clemson, 118).

FLORIDA STATE VS. SOUTHEAST MISSOURI – THE LAST GAME

Bob Sura scored 32 points and James Collins added 21 points as Florida State defeated Southeast Missouri by a 100-75 margin on December 22, 1994 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Corey Louis was the third Seminole to score in double figures with 19 as Florida State shot .633 percent from the field in the win. The Seminoles jumped on Southeast Missouri early and led by a 51-29 margin at halftime. Louis totaled a near triple-double with 19 points, 13 rebounds and five blocked shots while Collins and Andre Reid Added eight rebounds each. Sura led the Seminoles with eight assists. LaMarr Greer totaled seven assists. Jermall Morgan led Southeast Missouri with 16 points and eight rebounds. Pili Robinson totaled 12 points as all 12 players who earned playing time for Southeast Missouri scored at least two points. Morgan led Southeast Missouri in both pints and rebounds. Florida State limited Southeast Missouri to .373 shooting from the field and won the rebound battle by a 47-33 margin.

Senior Christ Koumadje pulled down his career-high of 11 rebounds in Florida State's victory over UConn (December 8). He has pulled down at least five rebounds in four games this season and in 11 games during his career.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.833 Redshirt Freshman Anthony Polite is shooting .833 from the free throw line for the season after a perfect four of four performance from the line in the Seminoles' 79-71 win over UConn.

MANN FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Senior Terance Mann, who continuously displays his skills from every inch of the basketball court, has fashioned himself as quite the 3-point shooter throughout his career, and especially as a senior. He has made seven 3-point field goals with one coming in seven of Florida State's first nine games of the season. He opened the second half of the Seminoles' victory over UConn with a 3-pointer to give his team a 42-33 (+9 point) lead. His shot from the bonusphere helped the Seminoles score the first eight points of the second half to help the Seminoles open up a 15-point lead in leading Florida State to the win. Mann has already made as many 3-point shots in the first nine games of the 2018-19 season as he did in 35 games as a sophomore (seven) and more than he made in 34 games as a freshman (four).

KABELGELE'S SCORING IMPROVEMENT

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele has scored 25 points in the last two games (15 against UConn and 10 against Troy) and enters Monday's game against Southeast Missouri as Florida State's second-leading scorer with a career-high 11.4 points per game scoring average. Leonard Hamilton's Emphasis On Academics Leads To FSU's impressive Graduate Rate

In a college basketball world that concerns itself with the next level and advancing ahead with the opportunity to play professionally, academics can often be pushed to the side.

The addition of the one-and-done rule in 2005 -- which required all draft-eligible players to be 19 and one year removed from high school -- unintentionally furthered the notion among these players that school is secondary to basketball.

All of this makes the hit rate with which Florida State men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton has seen his players graduate across his tenure in Tallahassee all the more impressive.

Since Hamilton took the FSU job ahead of the 2002-03 season, 61 of the 63 players (96.8 percent) that have enrolled and played for the Seminoles for at least four seasons left with their degrees.

The only two that didn't, former FSU players Al Thornton (2003-2007) and Solomon Alabi (2007-2010), have both reached out to FSU about finishing their degrees with online coursework as their playing careers wind down.

While this may seem impressive to many, Hamilton just views it as an expectation of someone in his position.

"It's part of our responsibility to take young men when they're teenagers and usher them into young adulthood," Hamilton told the *Tallahassee Democrat*.

"When you're a teenager, 17 or 18 years old, sometimes you're not in a position to make worldly decisions even though you might think that you are. I think that what we have always done is just set certain boundaries and certain expectations, try to hold everybody accountable to the things that we believe are important in the overall development of a young man, not as a basketball player but as an individual.

"What we've always tried to do is just treat everything like we would treat it if it was our own children. That's the way we look at it and so everything that we do totally in our program -- not only in academics but in everything that we do -- we try to treat it as such."

This is a belief that traces back to Hamilton's time as an assistant coach at Kentucky, where he won a national championship in 1978.

"That was part of my responsibility as a young assistant coach at the University of Kentucky for 12 years to make sure that I stay on top of the kids' academically," Hamilton said.

"I was at an institution that really placed a lot of emphasis on making sure that the kids not only played well, but they graduated."

With all the success the No. 10 Seminoles (8-1) have found early this season -- making the program's earliest appearance in the Top 10 since 1992 -- Hamilton sees the bigger picture when reflecting on his success at FSU.

"We truly believe that when you look around in my office and you see all those NCAA rings and watches and memorabilia, trophies, coach of the year awards, if that's where you place all the emphasis -- the fact that we have won a certain number of basketball games -- then I think we're very shallow in the big picture," Hamilton said.

"The most important thing we do is take young men and try to be a part during this period of life when you're taking them from teenagers to young adults. That is by far the most important thing we do as coaches.

"Now, there's no question that we need to win. That's part of the process, that's part of the job. But if we win and fail in the development of young people, in helping them grow in developing the tools that are going to give them a chance to be successful in life, we have failed."

A significant subset of this group of graduates are people who became the first in their direct family to attend or graduate from college.

Hamilton is quite aware of the fact that athletic scholarships could be the only means of some of his players earning college degrees and doesn't take that responsibility lightly.

"A lot of them will be the first people who have gone to college in their families. This is important because they many times change the whole culture of their family by them having academic success that compliments what most people want in athletic success," Hamilton said.

"Our rewards come five, six, seven, eight years after a kid has left us and what are they doing with their lives and their families and their careers. That's when our great report comes in.

"I'm hoping that as a staff when we hang our whistles up and we look ourselves in the mirror, that we will be able to say that we have done everything possible to help the young people that have been a part of our journey to have a place in our society that's meaningful and that they're not only proud of the fact that they represented the school, Florida State, but that we had the kind of relationships that they feel helped them become who they are in the next part of their lives."

Nichols Looks to Carry Over Success at Florida State

When looking at the newcomers on this year's Florida State men's basketball team, David Nichols finds himself in a position very few have been in before him. In actuality, only one person has.

Nichols came to Florida State from the University of Albany, where he spent his first three years of NCAA eligibility obtaining a bachelor's degree in communications. He is just the second graduate transfer in Florida State's history, the first being Jeff Peterson in 2012, who helped the Seminoles to their first ACC Championship.

In his first and only year as a Seminole, Nichols is looking to create the same immediate impact that Peterson did on the Seminoles' 2012 team.

In Florida State's game against UConn in the Never Forget Tribute Classic, he played his best game as a Seminole with 16 points – including 13 in the first half. Nichols' play against the Huskies helped the Seminoles to an important 79-71 win.

"I think it was an adjustment period, but everything's starting to really slow down," Nichols said of his recent play. "I'm starting to see the floor more, starting to see where to attack, when to keep the ball moving and when to find my shot. I just think I'm definitely getting more comfortable."

In his time at Albany, Nichols totaled 1,132 points. He averaged 16.5 points per game in both his sophomore and junior year and became one of only eleven Albany players in program history to score 1,000 or more career points in the America East Conference.

Last year as a junior, Nichols earned America East All-Conference First Team honors, as well as America East All-Tournament team honors.

However, Nichols wanted more.

While enjoying success at Albany, he decided that he wanted a greater challenge. In addition, he wanted the chance to compete for college basketball's most coveted prize – a national title. These desires are ultimately what led him to Tallahassee.

"When I was making my decision, it was kind of a mentality thing," Nichols said. "I didn't want to go somewhere where I'd shoot 20 shots a game, average 20 points and then be looking at the end of the year and not have made it to an NCAA tournament or not have achieved the team goals, which are important to me."

"I feel like I have the chance to do something special at Florida State with all the returning talent. We have a great opportunity to reach our team goals."

Just as Nichols was looking for a particular environment to play his final season of eligibility, the Seminoles were looking for a certain type of player to step into this role. Having lost two guards following last season in Braian Angola and C.J. Walker, the Seminoles needed an experienced guard who could come in and contribute right away. Nichols met those very needs.

"David has an unbelievable balance of experience, intelligence, toughness and a lot of grit that immediately transfers and enhances where we are as a team," said FSU assistant Dennis Gates. "He's given up a lot to be able to be in that position as a player, but also as a teammate. For him, he wanted an opportunity to play at a higher level, which says a lot about his personality."

Although a newcomer with this year's group, Nichols is certainly not a newcomer to college basketball. His experience has helped him become a leader for the younger members of this team in showcasing what it takes to

win in this regard. He represents an example for how to conduct oneself both on the basketball court and in the classroom as well.

While at Albany, Nichols earned a Presidential Scholar-Athlete Award for the 2017-18 academic year, one of only eleven student-athletes at the university to receive this honor. To be named to this list, a student-athlete must boast a 3.75 career GPA while earning his or her degree in that academic year. In addition, as a sophomore, he was honored as the America East Scholar Athlete of the year.

“David is a perfectionist,” Gates said. “He’s the epitome of a student-athlete and when you have a guy that’s able to be a great basketball player and a great student, you have to jump at that opportunity to have him as a part of your program.

“He approaches basketball the same way he approaches academics, he wants to win a national championship in both and that behavior bodes well in this environment.”

All of this considered, it is safe to say that Nichols brings quite a bit to the table. His own personal desires to succeed have led him to Florida State, while his past experiences and successes both on and off the court have shaped him to be an example right away.

While the season is still young, Nichols has already shown signs of the impact he can create. If all bodes well for the Seminoles, then come the end of this season, his impact will look much like that of Peterson’s in 2012.

With his experiences at Albany, there is no doubt that Nichols knows how to win. At Florida State, he has the opportunity to utilize everything he has learned and take that knowledge to the biggest stages in college basketball, playing against the best talent in the nation while helping Florida State accomplish its team’s goal of winning a national championship.
