NO. 20/21 SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO INDIANA IN 22ND ANNUAL ACC / BIG TEN CHALLENGE

Florida State, which defeated North Florida by an 86-58 margin in its season opener on December 2 in Tallahassee, plays host to Indiana in the 22nd Annual ACC / Big Ten Challenge on December 9, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles, who have won 39 consecutive non-ACC home games, face Indiana in their second of six home games to begin the 2020-21 season. Florida State's first game away from Tallahassee is scheduled for December 29 at Clemson. Florida State's original season and home opener – scheduled against Gardner-Webb – was postponed because of COVID-19 concerns in the GW program has been rescheduled for December 21 at 8:00 p.m. Following Wednesday's game against Indiana, the Seminoles will play host to Florida on Saturday December 12, at 11:00 a.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. INDIANA – CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays host to Indiana in the ACC/ Big Ten Challenge on December 9, 2020. The Hoosiers lead the all-time series against the Seminoles by a 5-0 margin. The 2020 game between Florida State and Indiana marks the second meeting between the two teams in the 22-year history of the ACC / Big Ten Challenge and the second in the last two seasons between the two teams. The Hoosiers are coached by Archie Miller who is in his third season at Indiana (2018-Present). He began his head coaching career at Dayton (2012-17) and has coached against Florida State just once. Miller has faced Florida State as an assistant at NC State (2005-06, once, 1-0) and at Ohio State, 2008-09, once, 1-0). Miller has also faced the Seminoles as a player – he was a four-year letter winner at NC State from 1999-02 – and was 1-7 against Florida State as a Wolfpack player. Tom Ostrom, the Co-Associate Head Coach for the Hoosiers, has faced the Seminoles 11 times in his career. He has faced the Seminoles as an assistant at Florida (1998-04, nine games against Florida State, 6-3) and South Alabama (2004-07, one game against Florida State, 0-1) and in last year's ACC / Big Ten Challenge. Co-Associate Head Coach Kenyan Hunter has been on the staffs at NC State and Nebraska when both of those programs faced the Seminoles.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST COACHES IN ACC

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game against Indiana as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 66-3 (.957 winning percentage) in its last 69 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Indiana having won .957 percent of their games (66-3) and .923 percent of their ACC games (36-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 1-0 at home this season, were 16-0 at home last season (including 10-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 24 CONSECUTIVE HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Indiana having won 24 consecutive games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent victory in Tallahassee came as an 86-58 win over North Florida on December 2, 2020. Florida State has won 17 consecutive ACC home games.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Indiana and win its fourth ACC / Big Ten Challenge game in the last five seasons. The Seminoles earned wins against Minnesota in 2016, at Rutgers in 2017 and against Purdue in 2018. The Seminoles have won two consecutive ACC / Big Ten Challenge games at home against Minnesota and Purdue;
...Defeat Indiana and win its 31st consecutive game that has been played in the state of Florida – each game since a 77-68 win at home over Clemson on January 22, 2019;
...Defeat Indiana and improve its record to 7-5 at home in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge. The Seminoles have won two consecutive home games in the Challenge.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 56-13 (.812 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 1-0 this season. Since falling to Indiana in the 2019 ACC / Big Ten Challenge on December 4, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 90 percent of their games with a record of 20-3.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE

Florida State, the 2012 and 2020 ACC Champion, plays host to Indiana in the 2020 ACC / Big Ten Challenge on Wednesday, December 4, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. SEMINOLES LAUDED AT ACC OPERATION BASKETBALL

Defending ACC Champion Florida State is picked to finish third in the 2020-21 league standings and newcomer Scottie Barnes was chosen as the Preseason ACC Freshman of the Year in a vote by the attending media at ACC Operation Basketball which was held virtually for the first time. Barnes is a Preseason All-ACC First Team Selection and senior M.J. Walker is a Preseason All-ACC Second-Team selection. Florida State's preseason selection of third in the ACC standings matches the highest in school history. The Seminoles were predicted to finish third in the standings in 1993 (and finished second) and 2012 (and won the ACC Tournament Championship). Florida State was picked to finish in fifth place in 2020 and won its first ever Regular Season ACC Championship with a 16-4 record. In earning the third place selection, the Seminoles were awarded 15 first place votes – the third highest first place vote total as one of five teams to earn a first place vote in the voting of 155 media members.

Devonte Green scored a career-high 30 points, knocked down five 3-pointers and helped fuel a late spurt with two big shots to lead Indiana past No. 17 Florida State 80-64 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge at Assembly Hall in Bloomington, Ind., on December 4, 2019. Green went 10 of 15 from the field, 5 of 7 on 3s and 5 for 7 at the free throw line. He also grabbed six rebounds and finished with three assists and two steals. Trent Forrest scored 13 to lead the Seminoles (7-2), who had their seven-game winning streak snapped. M.J. Walker and Devon Vassell added 10 points apiece.

SEMINOLES' FIRST TIME STARTERS AGAINST NORTH FLORIDA

Florida State sophomore center Balsa Koprivica and freshman guard Scottie Barnes made their first career starts in the Seminoles' win on Wednesday against North Florida. Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray made his 29th career start, redshirt junior Anthony Polite his ninth and senior M.J. was in the starting lineup for the 60th time as a Seminole.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.417 Senior M.J. Walker is shooting .417 from the 3-point line (five of 12) in three career ACC/Big Ten Challenge games. He was two of six from long range against Indiana in the 2019 Challenge.

.818 Senior M.J. Walker is shooting .818 from the free throw line in the last 10 games (nine last season and one this season). He has made 30 of his last 37 free throw attempts.

.955 Florida State has a home court winning percentage of .955 (63-3) in the last four seasons – the highest among Power 5 schools and second in the nation only to Gonzaga (.970, 64-2).

1 Florida State is undefeated, 1-0, when it outscores its opponent.

1 Senior M.J. Walker was Florida State's leading scorer in the Seminoles' season-opening win over North Florida. A total of nine players led the Seminoles in scoring during the 2019-20 season.

2 Florida State committed only two turnovers in the final 21 minutes of its victory over North Florida on Wednesday night in Tallahassee.

16 Florida State led the ACC with 16 ACC wins and was tied for the ACC lead in overall wins with 26 in 2020.

58 Florida State's 58 points in the first half of its 97-57 win over Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on November 29, 2005 is tied for the second highest point total in a half in the history of the Challenge. The Seminoles scored more points in the first half of their win over Purdue (58) than the Boilermakers scored in the entire game (57).

97 Florida State's 97 points against Purdue on November 29, 2005 is the seventh most points scored by a team in the history of the ACC / Big Ten Challenge. The Seminoles defeated the Boilermakers, 97-57, in Tallahassee.

98 Senior M.J. Walker will play in his 98th career game against Indiana on Wednesday night.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORY OVER NORTH FLORIDA...

...The Seminoles made more free throws (15) than North Florida attempted (12);

...The Seminoles forced North Florida into 24 total turnovers including 19 by their Osprey's starting five;

...The Seminoles never trailed, scored the first four points of the game and led for a total of 39 minutes and 28 seconds. The score was tied at 0-0 for the first 32 seconds of the game;

...The Seminoles outrebounded the Ospreys by a +15 margin (42-17);

...All 12 players who earned playing time for the Seminoles scored at least two points while 11 of the 12 Seminoles who earned playing time pulled down at least one rebound;

...Four Seminoles (Scottie Barnes, Sardaar Calhoun, Tanor Ngom and Quincy Ballard) all earned playing time for the first time as a Seminoles.

IT'S A STAPLE OF HAMILTON'S FLORIDA STATE PROGRAM – PLAYERS EARN PLAYING TIME

Playing time. Many minutes for many players. Those are just one of the staples of Florida State's program under 19th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. A total of 12 players earned playing time in Florida State's victory over North Florida – with each of those 12 players earning playing time before the second television timeout of the first half of the Seminoles' win over the Ospreys. Senior M.J. Walker led the team with 27 minutes of playing time (nearly four minutes above his career average of 23.2 minutes played per game) while nine players earned at least 14 minutes of playing time, 10 players totaled 10 or more minutes of playing time and all 12 players who played earned at least seven minutes of playing time in the win.

SEMINOLES EARN 2:1 ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO IN WIN OVER NORTH FLORIDA

Led by freshman Scottie Barnes (six assists and only two turnovers) and redshirt junior Wyatt Wilkes (career-high five assists and zero turnovers), the Seminoles totaled 19 assists and only 10 turnovers in their victory over North Florida. The Seminoles scored 50 points and committed only two turnovers in the second half in taking the win over the Ospreys. Florida State's primary ballhandlers (Barnes, Anthony Polite and M.J. Walker) totaled 10 assists and only three turnovers in 75 combined minutes played in the Seminoles' win.

GRAY LEADS SEMINOLES TO 12 STEALS AGAINST NORTH FLORIDA

Redshirt junior guard RaiQuan Gray totaled a near career-high four steals in Florida State's win over North Florida. His total led to at least one steal by eight of the Seminoles who earned playing time in the season-opening win. Florida State ranked second in the ACC with an average 5.2 steals per game average last season an average that ranked 12th nationally.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO BE STINGY ON DEFENSE

Florida State limited North Florida to 58 total points and a .380 field goal shooting percentage in its win over the Ospreys on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles ranked fourth in scoring defense (65.7 points per game allowed) and fifth in field goal shooting defense in the ACC during the 2019-20 season. It's inevitable that Leonard Hamilton's Seminoles are going to rank among the ACC and national leaders in scoring defense and field goal shooting defense.

WALKER PERFECT FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST NORTH FLORIDA

Senior M.J. Walker, who was a perfect six of six from the free throw line in the Seminoles' season-opening victory over North Florida, enters Wednesday's game against Indiana having made 11 consecutive free throws. His 11 straight makes (six against North Florida and five in Florida State's win over Notre Dame on March 4, 2020) has upped his career free throw percentage to .787 and moved him into a tie for 14th place in the school history in the career free throw shooting percentage category.

WALKER ON POINT FROM THE BONUS PHERE TO BEGIN HIS SENIOR SEASON

Senior M.J. Walker, who averages 1.4 made 3-point shots in each of the 97 games of his Florida State career, made three of five shots from the bonusphere in the Seminoles' season-opening victory over North Florida. His shooting performance from long range marked the eighth time in the last two seasons (32 games) that he had made three or more 3-point field goals in a game. Walker enters Wednesday's game against Indiana ranked 13th in school history with 132 made 3-point field goals and needs only 18 more made to become just the 10th player in school history with 150 or more career 3-point shots made.

WALKER NAMED TO JERRY WEST TOP SHOOTING GUARD WATCH LIST

M.J. Walker, who helped lead Florida State to the second ACC Championship in school history in 2020, has been named to the prestigious Jerry West Award Watch List by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The award is presented annually to the top shooting guard in college basketball. Walker is one of 20 players – and one of only two from the Atlantic Coast Conference – who will vie for the award. For Walker, it's the second time in his career that he has been named to the Jerry West Award Watch List. He also began his freshman season of 2018 as a candidate for the award.

BARNES NAMED TO BOB COUSY TOP POINT GUARD WATCH LIST

Scottie Barnes, who began his freshman season at Florida State on December 2 against North Florida, has been named as one of 20 candidates for the prestigious Bob Cousy Award which is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate point guard by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Barnes is one of only two players from the ACC and is one of only three freshmen in the nation named as preseason candidates for the award. Florida State has been well represented on the Cousy Award Watch List under Hamilton and is staff. Toney Douglas (2009), Xavier Rathan-Mayes (2016) and most recently Trent Forrest (2020) were also candidates for the award.

BARNES NAMED TO NAISMITH AWARD WATCH LIST

Scottie Barnes, who averaged 11.6 points, 6.5 rebounds and 4.6 assists in leading Montverde Academy to a 25-0 record as a senior in 2020, has been named to the watch list for the 2021 Naismith Trophy. The Naismith Trophy has been awarded to the top college basketball player in the nation since 1969. Barnes is one of eight players from the ACC and one of nine freshmen from around the nation on the watch list to begin the 2020-21 season.

BARNES NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State's Scottie Barnes is one of seven freshmen in the nation – and one of only two freshmen in the ACC – to be named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top-50 Watch List as the most outstanding player in college basketball. Barnes is among an outstanding group of players who are among the top candidates for the Wooden Award and the Wooden Award All-American Team chosen by a panel of college basketball experts.

BASKETBALL SIGNING CLASS STANDS TALL

Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and the Florida State Men's Basketball team has signed the nation's No. 2 ranked recruiting class which includes five-star guards Matthew Cleveland (6-6, Atlanta, Ga.), and Jalen Warley (6-5, Norristown, Pa.), along with four-star center John Butler (7-1, Greenville, S.C.) and the No 2 ranked junior college player in the nation center Naheem McLeod (7-4, Plymouth Meeting, Pa.). The blue-chip class includes two of the top 24 (Cleveland, No. 20 and Warley, No. 24), three of the nation's top 60 high school players (Butler, No. 60) and a top-two ranked junior college player (McLeod, No. 2). Hamilton and his staff have now attracted seven top-20 recruiting classes since becoming head coach at Florida State to begin the 2002-03 season. These recruiting classes have helped him build the fourth-winningest program in the ACC since the start of the 2005-2006 season. The only three ACC members that have won more in that span are Duke, North Carolina and Virginia, three schools coached by men who have combined to win nine national championships.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Senior M.J. Walker scored a game-high 17 points and No. 18 Florida State (1-0) opened its 2020-21 season with an 86-58 win against North Florida (0-4) at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles maintained a steady lead throughout the game in winning its 24th consecutive game at home. The win was the Seminoles' sixth consecutive in the series against North Florida. The win upped Florida State's record at the Tucker Center to 66-3 since a victory over Notre Dame on February 7, 2015. The Seminoles have won at home at a 95.6 percent winning percentage in the last four seasons. Reigning ACC Coach of the Year, Leonard Hamilton, has won his 24th opener in the last 26 seasons. Tonight's win also extends the Seminoles' second longest streak in the nation of 39 consecutive non-conference home games.
